

## Jaycee Air Circus Sunday to Attract Bevy of Private Planes

Pilots from all over the state will direct their planes toward Salem Sunday morning to participate, along with "Swede" Ralston and his Air Circus, in the Jaycee Air Show to start at 1 p.m. at McNary field.

Members of the Oregon Sportsmen's Pilots association will fly to Hillsboro early Sunday morning for a breakfast meeting and then take off for Salem with the Ralston Air Circus for lunch. All private planes will be grounded at 1 p.m. to leave the field clear for air show and airline activities. The show will be interrupted several times to permit the landing of two- and four-engined airline planes.

The Salem Motorcycle club will lead off, starting at 1:15 p.m. with demonstrations of trick riding, a balloon-breaking race, an Australian race and a speed race.

**Aerobatic Flying**  
Ralston's air circus troupe, which will take the air at 2 o'clock, composed of eight training and combat planes, specializes in aerobatic flying, upside down flying at near ground level and precision stunting. A delayed parachute jump is also on the program. National guard pilots, flying P-51s, will give a demonstration of formation flying during the afternoon.

Junior Chamber of Commerce air show chairman Dick Schmidt reported Friday night that accommodations for 18,000 people will be available, including 1,400 reserved seats.

The show will be staged on the west side of the airport and motorists leaving from the city are advised to use the Mission or 25th street approaches to the west side airport road. The airport road leading from State street to the east side entrance will be reserved for use of airline passengers and traffic wishing to by-pass the airport area.

**Tickets on Sale Today**  
Tickets to the show will be on sale today at two downtown booths located at High and Court streets and Liberty and Court streets. The Marion County chapter of the Red Cross will set up a first aid booth and tent at the show.

Twenty-five per cent of the profits will go toward flood relief, the remainder will be used by the Junior Chamber of Commerce to finance youth welfare activities in the Salem area including the school boy patrol, the Jaycees have announced.

## 2-Year Term For Car Theft

Junior Richard Bentz, 23, Detroit construction worker, was sentenced to two years in the state penitentiary by Circuit Judge E. M. Page Friday after pleading guilty to a charge of car theft.

Bentz was arrested by state police at Detroit early Friday morning on a warrant charging he stole an auto from the Rollins Motor company in Salem June 15. Bentz, police said, stored the car in a Mill City barn.

Friday morning Bentz waived district court preliminary examination and grand jury examination, pleaded guilty to auto larceny in circuit court and was sentenced late Friday afternoon. Police said Bentz ended a two-year sentence at the state penitentiary for auto theft last September. He was sentenced from Clatsop county.

## Auto License Test Proves Stumbling Block

Almost half of the persons applying for their first Oregon drivers license in May failed the written traffic law test on the first try, Secretary of State Earl T. Newberry announced here today. A brief study of the Oregon drivers manual brought success on the second attempt in most cases although the second test asks different questions. State examiners said this is not an unusual percentage of first-try failures.

The current agreement runs out June 30, but a strike could not begin until July 6 because the union members will be on vacation until that date. Efforts of the conciliation service to head off a strike got nowhere.

As the strawberry harvest in the Willamette valley rolls into high gear, calls for workers in canneries and berry patches came from the Salem office of the state employment service Friday.

Persons regularly employed by canneries are urged to contact the cannery of their choice immediately. William Baillie, manager of the local employment service office, said, workers are particularly needed at United Growers at Liberty where vacancies on both night and day shifts exist for men and women.

Growers in this area will pick today and Sunday, Baillie said. Information for drive-outs or for those wishing to be picked up at the office between 6 and 7 a.m. Sunday can be had by calling the office (9287) before noon today.

A bumper crop of berries this year is pushing pickers' wages to record heights. A grower in the Hazel Green area, where pickers are still needed, reported Friday that his crew of 160 workers averaged over \$1 per hour with an individual top salary of \$21 in a single day.

## Father of 4 Admits Murdering Wife, Beating Daughter

EVERETT, Wash., June 18—(AP)—A father of four children was held in the county jail here today after leading officers to the spot where his wife was bludgeoned to death and their four-year-old daughter was beaten senseless and pushed over a cliff with her.

Sheriff Tom Warnock said Wayne L. Williams, 31, admitted the killing and said he had left the tiny girl for dead.

The Williams family came from Tulsa county, Okla., only a week ago.

Attending physicians gave the girl, Mary Bernice, an even chance this afternoon to recover. Warnock said Williams told of beating his 27-year-old wife, Hat- tie Lucille, with rocks after pro- longer arguments over health, finances, his desire for a divorce and her insistence on returning to Oklahoma.

The sheriff said Williams told officers he beat the child unconscious with a rock when she came running from the car, screaming "Quit, daddy! Quit, daddy!" as he beat his wife with a rock and pushed her, dying, over the cliff.
