Fireworks, a beauty contest and a baseball game will be provided for Salem stay-at-homes on July 4, according to announcement Friday of American Legion posts 9 and 136.

The legion's annual Fourth of July celebration will be held Sunday night at Waters Park. In past years the affair has been held at the state fairgrounds.

Beaver Boys State is designed to teach 200 boys the fundamentals of American government. They will engage in eight days of actual practice of city, county and state government as set forth under the constitution.

**Methodist Church School to Continue This Week**

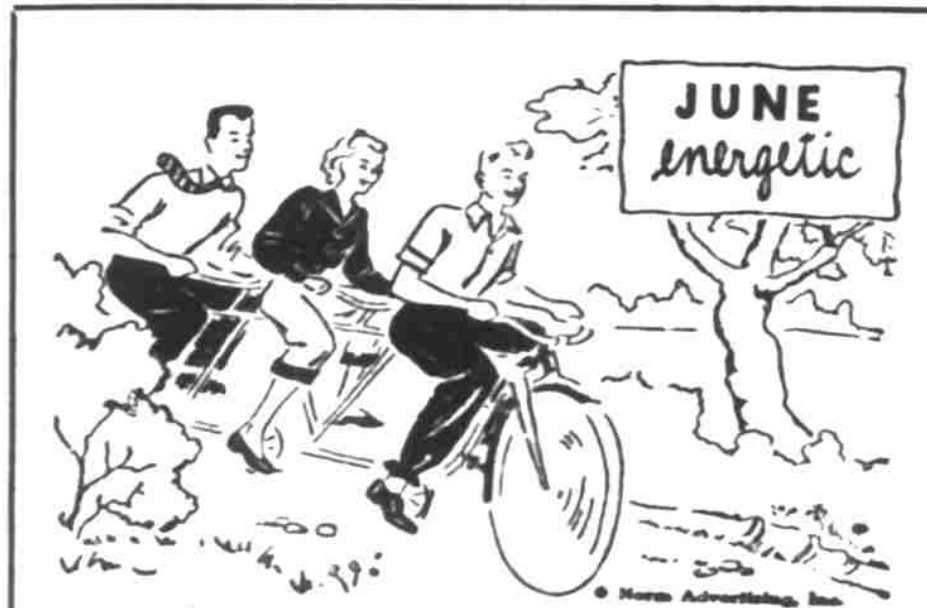
