To Take Cruise Many Placed In Farm Jobs In This Area

Two of 1,786 youths over the nation to win scholarships, they will sail from San Francisco to Seattle, back to Long Beach, Calif., out to Pearl Harbor and back to San Diego.

The Salem office of the state employment service was the second highest county office in the state last month in referrals of workers to agricultural jobs, the state un-

employment compensation commission reported last week.
The local office placed a total of 1,274 workers on Marion county farm labor jobs. This stood second only to the Ontario office, a heavy sugar-beet growing industry in eastern Oregon, which referred 1,737 workers.
A total of 808 referrals to non-agricultural jobs also was made last month by the Salem office. Of the total number of referrals, 308 were veterans. The county at the

first of this month had an active file of job-seekers totaling 1,823, of which 530 were veterans.
Fifty-two employers in Marion county, when surveyed by the commission, estimated that by September an additional 5,000 more jobs would be available than there are now. Most of this employment will be in food processing, logging, construction and in several retail trades.
Over the state employers made great strides in May toward re-

employment of many seasonal workers idle during winter months but disastrous flood conditions early in June forced many plants to shut down and offset the previous month's gain.
Nearly 4,000 were thrown out of work as a result of high waters in the Columbia basin, the commission reported. This brought the number of unemployed close to the 43,300 reported idle on May 1 in Oregon.
Busy Willamette valley districts, engaged in a variety of crops, were filling labor needs from nearby communities and normal in-migration, but shortages were expected in case of prolonged ripening weather.

BROOKS—Corsage making was demonstrated at the Garden club Thursday.

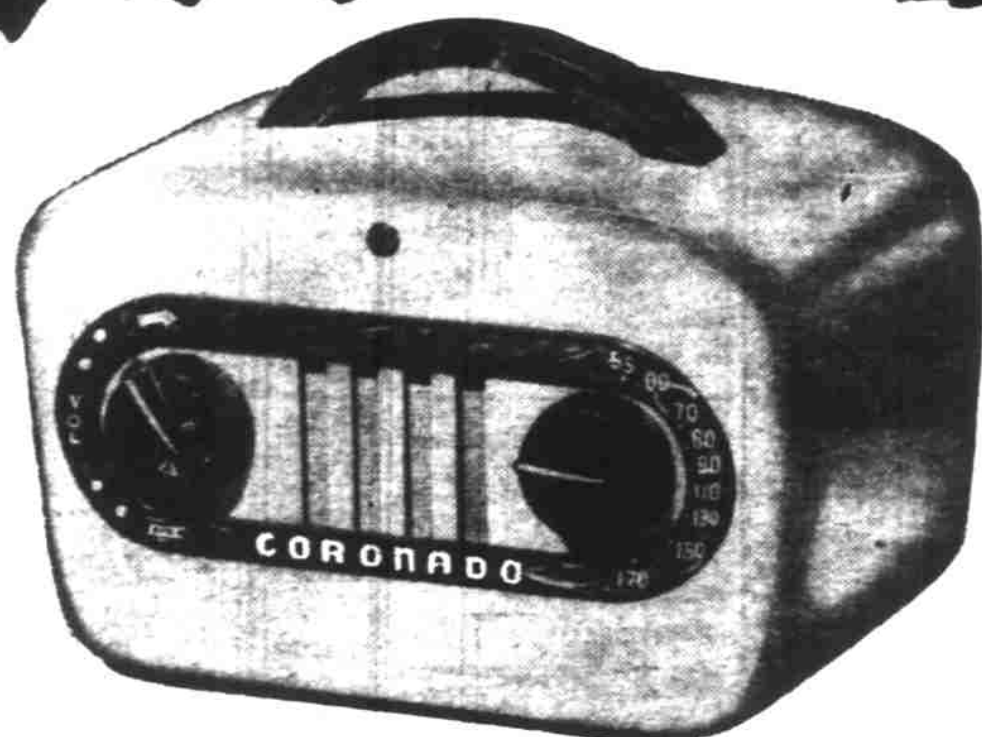
The Brooks fire department entertained the Marion County firemen's association with a buffet supper in their hall in Brooks Thursday night.
