

## Caps Face Alcos, Stars

Salem's semipro Capitols, now considered one of the top non-pro ball clubs in the state, face a busy week at Waters park. Manager Johnny Lewis' crew begins Wednesday night with an 8:15 game with Albany Alcos, leaders of the State circuit and half a game up on the second-place Salco. On Friday night, also at 8:15, the nationally famous and highly entertaining Hawaiian All-Stars come to town. Then on Saturday night the Caps take on the Bend Elks in another State league tilt, and meet the Benders again the following Sunday afternoon.

The three league games could easily mean the difference between winning or losing the championship for the Caps, but they are looking to the exhibition tilt with the crack Islanders Friday with equal importance. The Stars are loaded with the cream of the baseball crop in the Islands and last year, after compiling a fine record on their tour of the USA entered the National tournament and finished a strong third. ## Gophers Surprise, Win NCAA Title; USC Second

MINNEAPOLIS, June 19—(AP)—Underdog Minnesota captured the national collegiate track and field championship for the first time in the 27-year history of the meet today as this country's undergraduate spiksters selected 108 of their best performers for the coming Olympic tryouts.

The surprising Gophers, ranked over the team title, won two of the 18 events and placed in seven others to amass a total of 46 points.

Southern California's favored Trojans finished in second place with 41½ points, barely missing their bid to regain the national title they relinquished in 1944 after nine straight years of victory. Even a double sprint triumph by the great Mel Patton, one of them achieved in world record time, couldn't lift the Trojans to the team championship they have won a dozen times in the past.

Not until the last event had been completed before a throng of 15,563 in the sun drenched stadium was the close battle for team honors determined. Then Loyd Lamola, who until that time had scored only one point on a sixth in the broad jump, came through with a victory in the lightly regarded hop step and jump which enabled Minnesota to sweep past the Trojans into first place.

Behind Minnesota and Southern California came the University of Texas with 40 points, while the University of Illinois, defending champion and winner of three of the last four team titles, finished fourth with 34½ points.

## Kahut, Maxim Meet Tuesday

PORTLAND, June 19—(Special)—One of the biggest boxing shows in the history of Portland will be presented at the civic auditorium Tuesday night. Woodburn Joe Kahut and Joey Maxim, third-ranking heavyweight in the United States will fight the 10-round main event. Another ten-rounder will send Jack (Ginger) Snapp of Klamath Falls, against Leroy Wade, highly-rated San Franciscan.

In one six-rounder it will be Jesse Hall, popular Los Angeles negro, against Sailor Jack Huber of San Francisco. Another six-rounder brings on the popular veteran Jack Chase to tangle with Eddie Ward of Chicago. The first bout gets under way at 8:30 o'clock.
