Advance in Corn Prices

CHICAGO, June 19--(AP)--There was enough concern over the prospect of a mostly clear week-end in the mid-west to cause an advance in corn today. The yellow cereal's strength was reflected in better prices for wheat and oats on the board of trade.

Grains had a firm tone throughout nearly the entire session, although dealings were not active. The only hesitancy was right at the start, when wheat dipped fractionally.

From that time to the close, prices held above yesterday's finish. At the end, wheat was 3/4-1/2 higher, July \$2.31 3/4-1/2, corn was \$2.22, oats were 3/4-1/2 higher, July 94 1/4-1/2, and soybeans were unchanged to a cent higher, July \$4.19.
