The large crane shed at the mill is being put into shape by a crew of carpenters and a resaw and chain installed. The mill has one of the largest dry kilns in western Oregon and is turning out finished lumber from green stock processed by smaller mills owned by Oregon Pulp and Paper.

Linn Strawberries Average Large as Harvest Near Peak

LEBANON—Strawberry picking in eastern Linn patches has reached a peak this week, with continued good picking forecast for another 12 to 16 days.

Most berry growers report the average box of berries contains between 20 and 25, with pickers averaging a carrier every 15 feet.

Cane berries, including raspberries, blackcaps and logans, will be ready for the first light picking late next week, although major pickings won't commence until around July 4.

Prices for the canes have not yet been set by growers, but they have announced transportation will be furnished to the field for pickers living at any distance.

Mammoth Berries Displayed at Lebanon

LEBANON — Fifteen strawberries that completely filled a one pound box were displayed this week in Lebanon by C. L. Johnson, star route 1.

Heavy rains during the maturing season has produced a surplus of mammoth berries, Johnson, who has a six acre patch four miles south of Lebanon, reports.

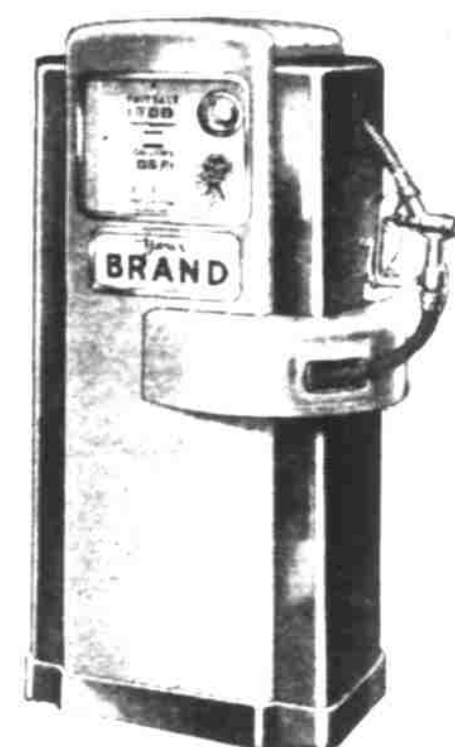
