## Repeal of Law To Be Sought By Silverton

**SILVERTON**—The 187 cities in Oregon with less than 5000 population are being urged in letters going out this week from the road committee of the Silverton Chamber of Commerce, to write state legislators requesting them to repeal the 1947 law providing increases from five to 10 per cent in the funds out of the state highway fund for maintenance and construction of streets through individual use of cities. Silverton's roads committee, headed by Dr. P. A. Loar, the letter states, wants the city allotments back to five per cent where it was before 1947.

Under the new provision, Dr. Loar pointed out, the small towns receive so little for new construction that it would take years to get any appreciable work done.

In explaining the local committee's stand, Dr. Loar says that the act is definitely not in the interest of the 187 smaller cities and will result in the "big city subtly robbing us of our state highway fund," and also that it was not "in the interest of the rural population."

The roads' chairman states he is convinced that the smaller towns are not equipped to use economically the funds they received. He pointed out that the commission was originally created to build roads between centers of population and not in them; that Portland was apportioned \$870,584; that the 17 cities over 6000 population got \$1,922,138 while all other incorporated towns got \$221,191, less than Portland's share alone.

## Surge Carries Stocks to Peak

**NEW YORK, July 2 (AP)**—A last-minute surge ahead today carried the stock market to a new peak since August 1948.

Closing prices were up fractions to around 2 points and more.

The power behind the market came from railway issues, many of which sold at top prices for the year or longer. Oils took second place. These two groups have managed to stay in front of the market for some time.

Trading got off to a slow start, quietly but steadily expanded, and the final hour reached a climax. Despite the pick-up, though, total turnover amounted to only 920,000 shares, of which 330,000 sold in the last hour alone. This compared with Thursday's meager 820,000.

An interesting angle to the advance was the fact that it occurred just before a long holiday. Normally Wall Street likes to take it easy before closing up shop for an extended recess.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks balanced 5 of one point to 71.8. The rail component was up 1.3 point at 47.3.
