A picking price averaging from 3 to 4 cents per pound is being paid.

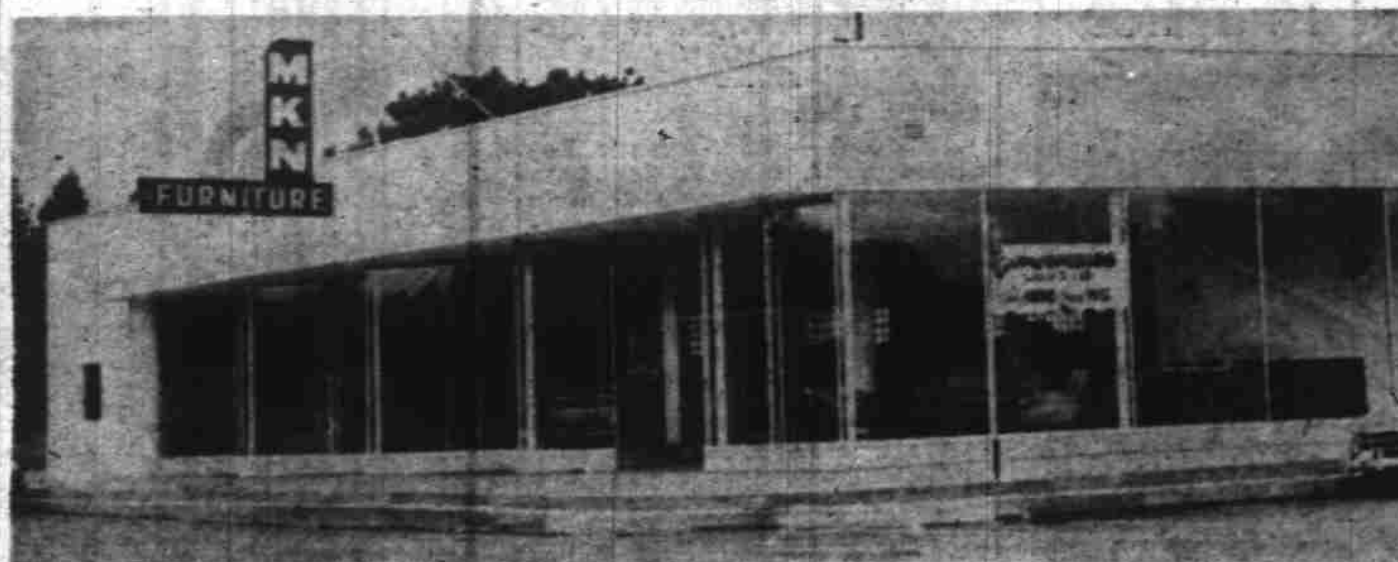
Drainage District Adds New Areas

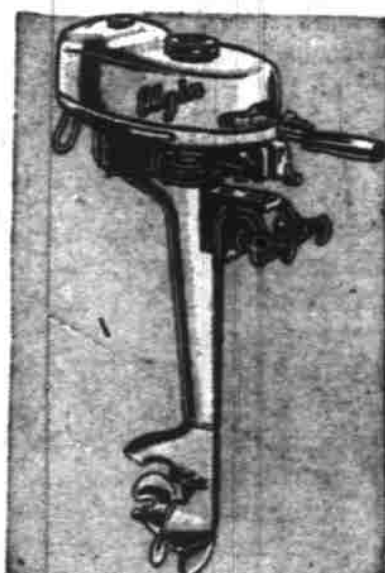

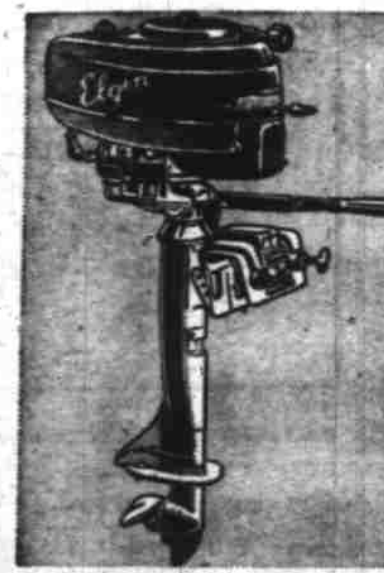
