3rd Rural Church Conference Opens Monday in Corvallis

With many country schools, through consolidation, being removed and no longer serving as community centers, efforts are being made to make the rural churches play a more important part in all phases of community life.

This will be the general theme of the third annual Oregon leadership institute for town and country churches to be held at Oregon State college July 12 to 16.

This institute is sponsored by Oregon State college in cooperation with the Oregon Council of Churches, the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, and the Home Mission Council of North America.

Topics selected for the institute include, Tuesday, July 13, "The Rural Church of Oregon in Modern Setting," Wednesday, "Co-operative Leadership," Thursday, "Women as Rural Leaders," and Friday, "Youth Participation."

That sectarianism and denominationalism have been responsible for the belief that the rural churches need not be a "socially effective organization" is the statement of R. C. Clark, Oregon historian. As the majority of church workers today believe that unless it is a socially effective organization it can have no success, they have set about seeking re-organization of rural churches.

Included is Pleasant Grove, the oldest Presbyterian church still standing in the state. Descendants of the first settlers of the community who established the church near Aumsville in 1854, together with others, are restoring the building with hopes that eventually services, discontinued at the beginning of the war, will be held again.

Because the rural church is once more becoming the "meeting house," sectarianism is fading in importance in some localities. As such the North Howell Community church, where pastors of various denominations have spoken from the pulpit and whose members recently erected a new brick building, is pointed out. It is, members say, like early days in Oregon church history when Joseph Gervais, a Catholic, invited Jason Lee, Methodist, to hold services at his house with the French settlers generally joining in the Methodist services until their priests arrived.

Rural pastors interviewed this week said that it is no longer uncommon for people from various communities or towns as well as from various denominations to motor out to one of the rural churches for the morning services.

However, one of the largest rural churches in Oregon and one which has maintained a high attendance for its 58 years, is denominational, the Pratum Memorial church, six miles east of Salem. Its membership is slightly over 180 and a Sunday attendance of well over 150 is not unusual. The pastor is the Rev. W. A. Regier.
