Mark Wessel and Sherman Starr, noted duo-pianist, will present a concert Wednesday at 8:15 p. m. at Waller hall as a special feature of the summer session of Willamette university.

Mr. Wessel, a student of Josef Lhevinne in piano and of Arnold Schoenberg in composition, is known widely both in this country and abroad as a performer and composer. In recognition of his accomplishments, he has been the recipient of a Guggenheim fellowship and a Pulitzer prize in composition. Not only has he appeared frequently with leading symphonic organizations in the United States, but with the Vienna and Budapest Philharmonic orchestras. Mr. Wessel recently retired from the piano department of the University of Colorado to devote himself to concertizing, composing, lecturing and teaching.

Mr. Starr has done advanced work in music with Ernest Toch, Hans Eisler and John Crown. During the war years he was soloist and accompanist with a G. I. choral group that achieved distinction on the west coast. He has been active musically in Utah and Colorado.

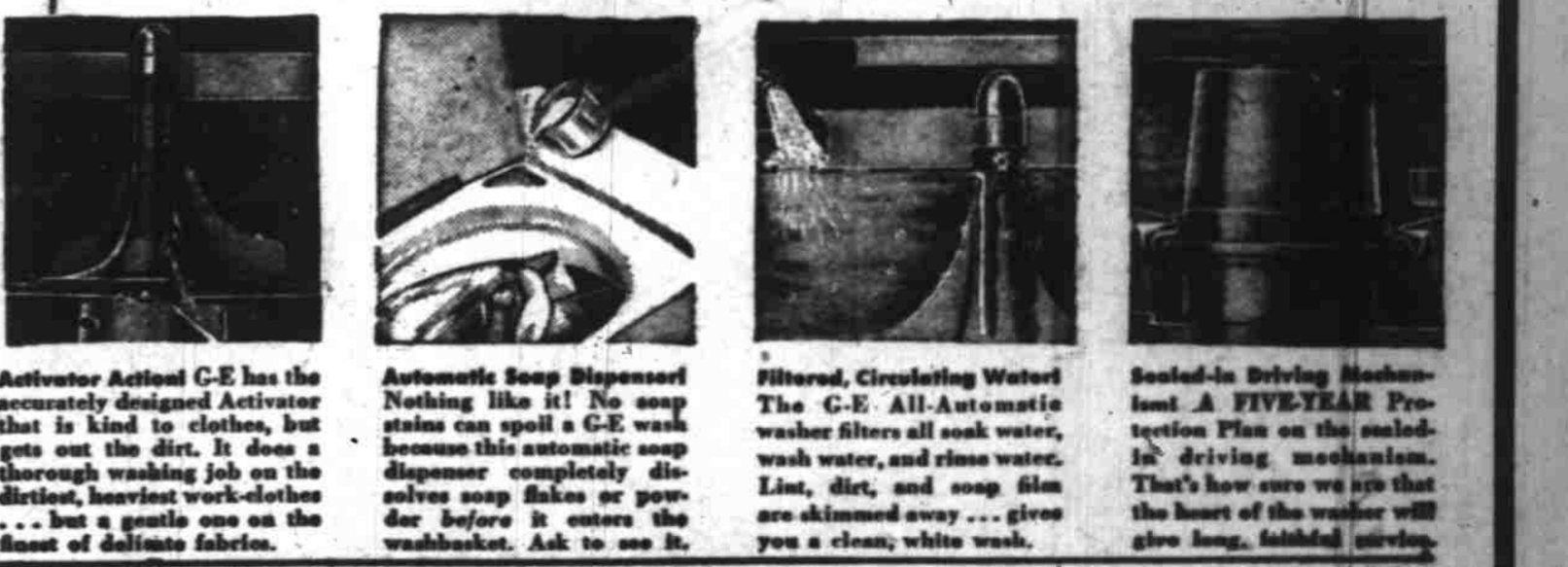
