Guardsmen to Compete for State Trophy

Pay day was held at the meeting of company B, 162nd infantry regiment, Oregon national guard, and headquarters company, 41st division, at Salem armory Monday night. Payroll amounted to \$2,148.67, Capt. Burl Cox, commander, announced.

Main business of the meeting was cleaning and turning in summer camp equipment, Cox said. The company will also compete, he said, for a newly established Eisenhower trophy, for the outstanding army unit of the national guard in each state during the next year.

The winning company is to be selected by a board composed of the state adjutant general, the senior tactical Oregon commander and the senior army instructor of the state. Selection is to be based on companies having 100 per cent enlisted strength; 90 per cent enlistment maintenance during competitive period and training qualifications, Cox said.

Douglas Adds Written 'No' For Politics

PORTLAND, July 12.—(AP)—Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas took himself out of democratic politics today while considering his son's tonsils and an outing to Hart Mountain antelope refuge.

While reporters waited for his statement in his hotel room today, Justice Douglas was finishing up a telephone call on plans for the annual Order of Antelope meeting near Lakeview, Ore., this weekend. He is keeper of the canteen for the annual fun fest.

At the same time he was wondering about his vacation at the beach. His 6-year-old son Bill has been troubled with his tonsils. If they are to come out, the justice will stay here for a few days. If not, he will go to Oysterville, Wash.

When Douglas finished his Hart Mountain phone call, he stood up, pulled a sheaf of papers from his pocket and handed out the statement which ended speculation on his availability for either the presidential or vice-presidential nomination at the democratic convention.

"I am not available," it said.

Faces Must Stay 'As Is' in Berlin

BERLIN, July 12.—(AP)—Face lifting was ruled out today under Berlin's blockade conditions.

An official British statement classed it as an "unessential operation." Enough anesthetics have been flown in for "necessary operations" during the next two months, the statement said. But

"Some surgeons, however, have been carrying out operations such as face lifting which are unlikely to be judged as essential by the general public or to justify the exclusion of food and other important requirements from the air lift."

Lebanon Youth Fatally Hurt In Auto Crash

ALBANY, July 12.—Funeral arrangements were complete today for Walter Albert Emmett, 21, Lebanon, whose car left the highway near the Cottonwoods three miles east of here early Saturday night. Emmett died Sunday night in Albany General hospital, where he was taken following the accident.

Albany city police records show that the car Emmett was driving was reported stolen from Dan Roth, Albany, at 7:10 p.m. Saturday, and an Albany ambulance received a call to cover the accident at 7:20 p.m. Police reported that skid marks showed he had skidded 600 feet. The car was a complete wreck, police said.

Emmett was born in Oklahoma City, Okla., on June 30, 1927, and came to Linn county six years ago. He had lived in the Lebanon and Lacombe area since then except for 18 months in the army.

He is survived by his parents, Walter A. Emmett, Eugene, and Mrs. Pansy Hester, and a stepfather, Charles Hester, both of Lebanon; a sister, Dorothy May Cunningham, Lebanon; grandmother, Sally Hardwick, Lebanon, and two stepbrothers.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 2 p.m. from Howe-Huston chapel, Lebanon, with interment in Lebanon IOOF cemetery.

Meat Prices Break Record

PORTLAND, Ore., July 12.—(AP) Meat on the hoof hit another all-time high here today.

A consignment of fat spring lambs brought \$27 per hundred at the North Portland stockyards, \$1 above the old mark. A truckload of 12 steers from Scappoose brought \$84.25, topping the record by 25 cents.

Wholesale prices of other items on the dinner table went up. Eggs climbed one cent a dozen on all grades. New wholesale price on grade A was 61 cents. Two top grades of butter also jumped a cent. Effective tomorrow retailers will pay 38 cents for grades A and AA butter.
