Jefferson Highway Traffic Numbered

JEFFERSON — A special count of cars was made at the intersection of Jefferson road and the Pacific highway at the overhead crossing west of here last Thursday.
During an eight-hour count from 6 a.m. until 2 p.m., a total of 2,837 vehicles passed that point with the heaviest traffic, 418 vehicles, between 11 a.m. and noon. During the eight hours, 60 per cent or 1,125 of the passenger cars bore Oregon licenses; 746 were out of the state.
