Dixiecrats Map Anti-Truman Election Plans

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., July 16—(P)—Revolutionary southern democrats planned today to take their battle for anti-Truman electors into the president's home state of Missouri and at least a dozen other states.

These moves were mapped at pre-convention caucuses today by delegates to the states' rights meeting called by Gov. Fielding H. Wright of Mississippi. A decision today by the caucus also included a plan to have states' rights electors on the ticket in Kentucky, home state of Senator Alben Barkley.

One leader of the southern revolt predicted the man nominated here tomorrow would "carry more states than Mr. Truman."

The leader who made the prediction declined use of his name "until tomorrow's meeting."

Alabama and Mississippi, with 20 electoral votes between them, already are committed against Mr. Truman. He named as "certain against Truman and probably for our nominee," the following states: Georgia, 12 electoral votes; South Carolina, 8; Florida, 8; Arkansas, 9; Louisiana, 10; Texas, 23; Virginia, 11.

Tennessee's 12 and North Carolina's 14 electoral votes, he said, either will go for the Birmingham nominee or for Gov. Thomas E. Dewey.

Eleven-House Project Okayed By Engineers

Bresco, Inc., Salem, received permits from the city engineer's office Friday to build 11 houses with attached garages in the Mapleton addition in northwest Salem at a cost of \$7,000 each.

The addition, created by the company recently, now contains about 50 new homes. The new units will be built in the 500 and 600 blocks of Biller avenue.

Another permit for new construction went to Gudman Rumstrom to build a house at 1545 Norway st., at a cost of \$9,000. U. F. Neiderhiser was authorized to repair a home at 255 E. Superior st., to cost \$350.

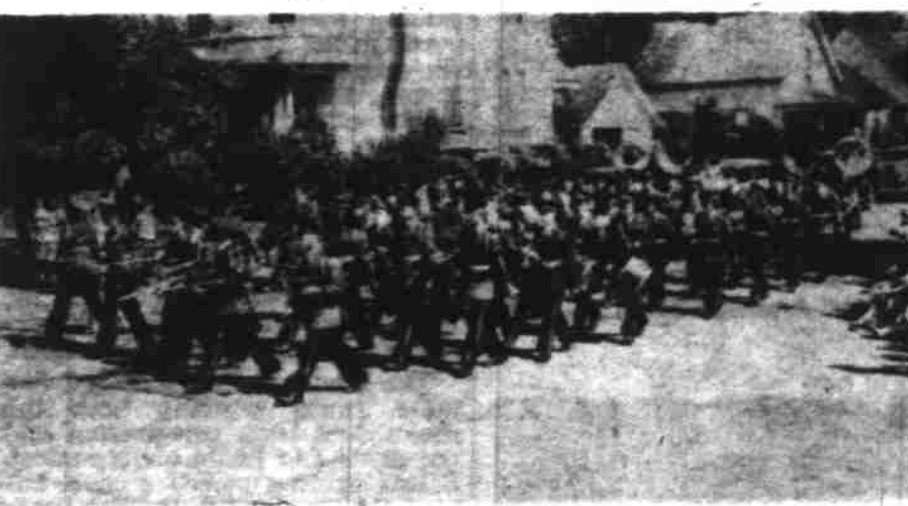
