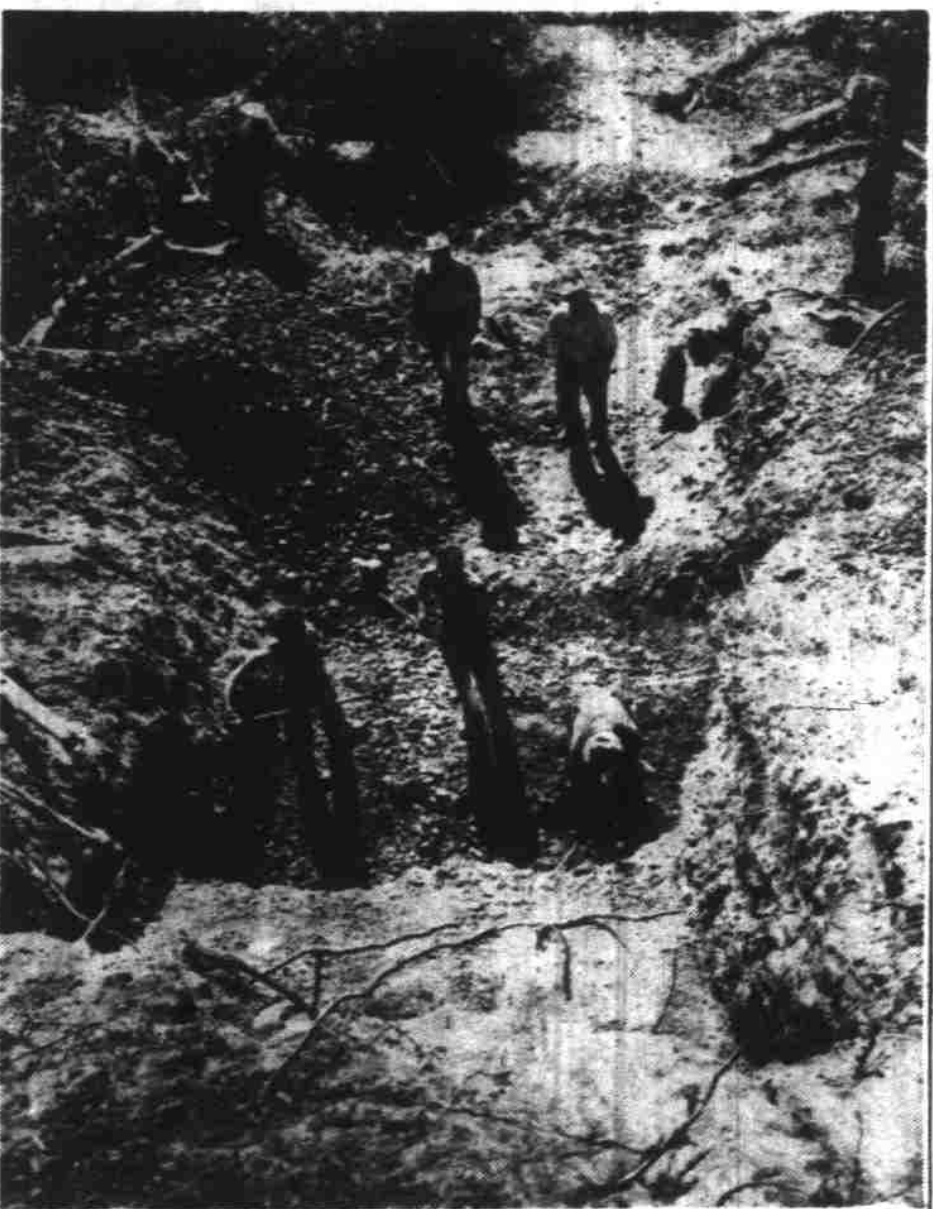


City Sewer Project Underway



A six-foot interceptor line for Salem's sewage disposal system will be laid on a line with the swath cut through the trees shown above in the city's woodlot on North River road. A new dragline recently purchased by the city will dig the ditch for the mammoth sections of the concrete pipe line. The picture was taken from the edge of the Willamette river looking east.
