

Dayton Police Brace Against Strike Action

DAYTON, O., July 27-(AP)—Dayton's police force went on an emergency schedule tonight, apparently for the duration of the strike at the Univis Lens Co.

Police Chief R. F. Wurster said his policemen had been placed on two 12-hour shifts. This action followed by several hours an outbreak of violence along a CIO-United Electrical Workers picket line when Univis employees, answering a back-to-work call by the company, tried to enter the plant this morning.

Policemen pierced the 200-person picket line with a flying wedge. They formed a corridor through which non-strikers returned to work. One such employee was struck down by a picket, who managed to dodge past the police detail.

Police said seven pickets were arrested, including those arrested in disorders at the plant yesterday. The plant had been strike-bound since May 5. In a national labor relations board election, called last Friday at the request of 300 Univis employees, local 768 of the CIO United Electrical Workers union was dismissed, 302 to 272, as bargaining agent for Univis employees.

70 Groups Not Overwhelming

NEW YORK, July 27-(AP)—Lt. Gen. George E. Stratemeyer, head of the air defense command, said today Americans should not be "overwhelmed" by the 70 groups of aircraft in our air force before our enemies were defeated.

The general said the United Nations was "the only real solution for world peace."

Fire Destroys 500 Acres Wheat Land

WALLA WALLA, July 27-(AP)—Fire fanned by a 40-mile-an-hour wind, roared over 500 acres of the Columbia basin's highest producing wheat this afternoon and destroyed a barn, sheep camp and burned over 200 acres of range land before it was controlled this evening.

Three farm homes were in the path of the fire but were saved when the wind suddenly sent the fire in another direction. Firemen plowed ditches around Kahlotus when it was feared that the fire would creep into the town.

Tattooed Cowboy Arrested on 2nd Kidnaping Count

GEARHART, Ore., July 27-(AP)—"Cowboy Jim" Bugg, who once was jailed because a youthful radio crime story listener recognized him as a fugitive, was in jail again today.

The new arrest was in connection with the old charge—the kidnaping of a Missouri sheriff. He was taken on a Missouri warrant and held on \$5,000 bail. He refused to waive extradition.

Last spring Bugg worked as a riding academy instructor. Youngsters noted that he had the words "L-O-V-E" tattooed on his fingers. Then a radio broadcast a warning for a fugitive. One of the clues was such tattooing on the fingers.

He was arrested and returned to Tulsa, Okla., on a warrant charging kidnaping of the Greenfield, Mo., sheriff and taking him to Kellyville, Okla.

Sheriff Paul Carney of Clatsop county said Bugg's second arrest yesterday was on a warrant from Jasper county, Missouri, charging specifically with kidnaping a taxi driver while armed in connection with the kidnaping of the sheriff.

Bugg had returned to Gearhart, free on bail until October.

Restaurant Wage Dispute Goes to Arbitration Unit

Salem culinary alliance's wage dispute with local restaurant owners was placed by the union into the hands of Salem Trades and Labor council's arbitration committee Tuesday night.

Negotiations between restaurants and the union have reached a virtual stalemate since the alliance asked a pay raise of 10 cents an hour and subsequently voted to strike against restaurants not meeting the pay request. Union officials said about half the 100 restaurants here agreed to the new pay scale.

The council's arbitration committee will seek to reopen negotiations with employers this week. Committee members are F. M. Keith, H. E. Barker and Bert Landon. The new pay scale would give waitresses wages ranging from 82 1/2 to 75 cents an hour based on their experience.

3 Lowell Buildings Destroyed by Fire

EUGENE, Ore., July 27-(AP)—Fire destroyed three buildings in the community of Lowell, southeast of here, today, and threatened for a while to sweep through the entire business district.

A garage, a warehouse and a partly finished dwelling were destroyed. All belonged to Frank Faylor. A school bus and three automobiles in the warehouse also were destroyed.

Veteran Postal Clerk Admits \$40,000 Theft

LOS ANGELES, July 27-(AP)—A sad story of afternoons playing the races and evenings worrying about his losses followed today the surrender of a trusted postal clerk.

Andrew A. Benson, 40, chief clerk at the Inglewood, Calif., postoffice and a 20-year veteran of the service, acknowledged embezzlement of \$40,000 in government funds to U. S. Commissioner Howard V. Calverly.

French Premier Marie Announces New Cabinet

Bradley Backs Segregation in Units of Army

FORT KNOX, Ky., July 27-(AP)—Segregation of white and Negro units in the lower levels of the army was advocated here today by Gen. Omar Bradley, the army's chief of staff.

General Bradley told a news conference, however, that he favored combining these units to form larger organizations, such as battalions and divisions.

President Truman yesterday issued an executive order establishing a committee on "equality of treatment and opportunity" in the armed services.

The general declared: "Sure we've got a caste system. Do you know of any major industry that doesn't have? It's incentive that makes this country work the way it does."

He added, however, that the separation of officers and enlisted men should apply only to military relations.

Jones Denies Allegations

An answer admitting and denying was filed in Marion county circuit court Tuesday by Ronald E. Jones, and Labish Celery Growers cooperative to an amended complaint filed by Haroshi Kaneko.

Jones admitted that he was paid \$30,000 by the cooperatives. He alleged that Kaneko's charge that this sum was paid without consideration on Jones' part is not true. He asks that the complaint by Kaneko be dismissed.

Kaneko alleges that he was a member of the association on June 14, 1946, when the association voted to pay \$30,000 to Jones. He charged that Jones received the money without consideration and asked for a decree for the benefit of the association to the effect that Jones repay the money.

Fairbanks Selects New City Manager

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, July 27 — Irving H. Call, former city engineer for North Adams, Mass., today was hired by the Fairbanks city council as city manager at a salary of \$9,000 yearly.

Call, on August 15, will succeed Louis D. Kelsey, former city manager from Milwaukee, Ore., who resigned the Fairbanks post last April.

NON-FARM JOBS AT HIGH

Salem Woman Hurt In Highway Crash

Cars driven by Robert Dade, Salem, and an unidentified Californian were involved in an accident on highway 99E at the junction of Pringle road south of Salem Tuesday afternoon. Mrs. Dade, passenger in the car driven by her husband, was reported taken to a local hospital for treatment of shock, but was not admitted as a patient.

Dade reported he was traveling south and attempted to make a left turn into Pringle road. He said he did not see the other car approaching from the south. The Dade car was hit broadside and was extensively damaged. Considerable damage was done to the front of the California car, but its lone occupant was uninjured.

Central Oregon Greets Joyce

REDMOND, July 27-(AP)—Farm work nearly halted in central Oregon today because Joyce Davis came home.

Fire sirens sounded in Madras, Culver, Metolius, Terrebonne and Redmond as a state police escort conducted the 18-year-old girl, named Miss Oregon last week end, to her home here.

Cow hands and farm workers rushed into towns enroute. Some of the overalled crew picked up instruments and joined bands tooting for her benefit.

Oregon Solons Blast 'Oration'

WASHINGTON, July 27-(AP)—President Truman's message to congress today was called a "political speech" by Oregon republicans.

Senator Cordon said the joint meeting was compelled to listen to a "democratic candidate's acceptance speech."

Rep. Ellsworth said congress had turned down the president's program in the regular session. "Calling the special session," he said, "was purely political and therefore represents the most contemptible campaign trick in our political history."

Rep. Angell called the speech "campaign oratory," but said he believes congress should attempt to solve the high cost of living and housing problems.

Rep. Norblad declined comment. Senator Morse did not arrive in time to hear Mr. Truman.

Arrests Clear 245 Bad Checks

Detective Wayne Parker, of Salem city police, reported Tuesday that 211 fictitious check cases had been reported to city police since January 1.

Parker said that 245 check cases have been cleared this year by arrest (some of these were reported in 1947) and there were 34 convictions.

Dellwo Named Champ Speaker

New champion speaker for Toastmasters International is Robert D. Dellwo of Spokane, Wash., the "toastmaster" who recently beat out Ralph Nohlgren, Salem restaurateur, for the Pacific northwest zone speaking contest in Portland.

Associated Press reported from San Francisco last night that Dellwo won with a five-minute speech on juvenile delinquency. Col. A. C. Gonzales of Monrovia, Calif., was runner-up.

Among 800 delegates at the Toastmasters convention were Stearns Cushing, Robert Batdorf and E. A. Bradford of the Capital Toastmaster club of Salem.

Man's Body Found Near Hillsboro

HILLSBORO, Ore., July 27-(AP)—The body of a man, apparently dead six months to a year, was found today in woods west of Portland.

A surveying crew discovered it about a mile west of Mt. Calvary cemetery.

Fred Sewell, Washington county coroner, said there was no evidence of violent death. There was, however, no identification on the body. He thought it was that of a bald, elderly man.
