Apathy Marks Stock Trading; Market Falls

NEW YORK, July 28—(AP)—The stock market ran into trouble today after trying to get ahead in earlier trading. Downward tendencies that de-

veloped in the final hour were credited more to investment and speculative apathy than any aggressive selling. Price changes either way were mostly around a point or less.

Today's news concerning Berlin was regarded as having taken a turn for the worse.

Professional trading operators were probably affected to a degree by talk in the financial district that there had been a slight pick-up in sentiment in Washington favoring an excess profits tax.

Corporation reports continued to range from satisfactory to excellent. Stocks of many companies affected responded with higher prices. But the news that lead and zinc had been boosted to the highest quotations on record failed to budge stocks of metal companies out of a fractional range.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 2 of one point to 69.72 from 70.84, which appeared on the ticker tape, 324 advanced while 420 declined.

Sales amounted to only 840,000 shares.



CHICAGO, July 28—(AP)—Grains mostly ended with small advances on the board of trade today. Much of the market's early strength was lost when selling expanded in the last hour.

Wheat closed 1/4 lower to 3/4 higher, September \$2.28 1/2-3/4; corn was 1/4 lower to 2 cents higher, September \$1.74 1/4-3/4; soybeans were 1 cent higher, September 75 1/4-3/4; rye was 4 cents lower, December \$1.76, and soybeans were 1 to 6 cents lower, November \$2.82-2.81.
