State Institutions Cut Food Costs by Heavy Production

Value of farm production at Oregon's state institutions for the current biennium was estimated in excess of \$1,400,000 by state board of control officials Saturday. They said this production would reduce the cost of food-stuffs at the institutions by 40 per cent.

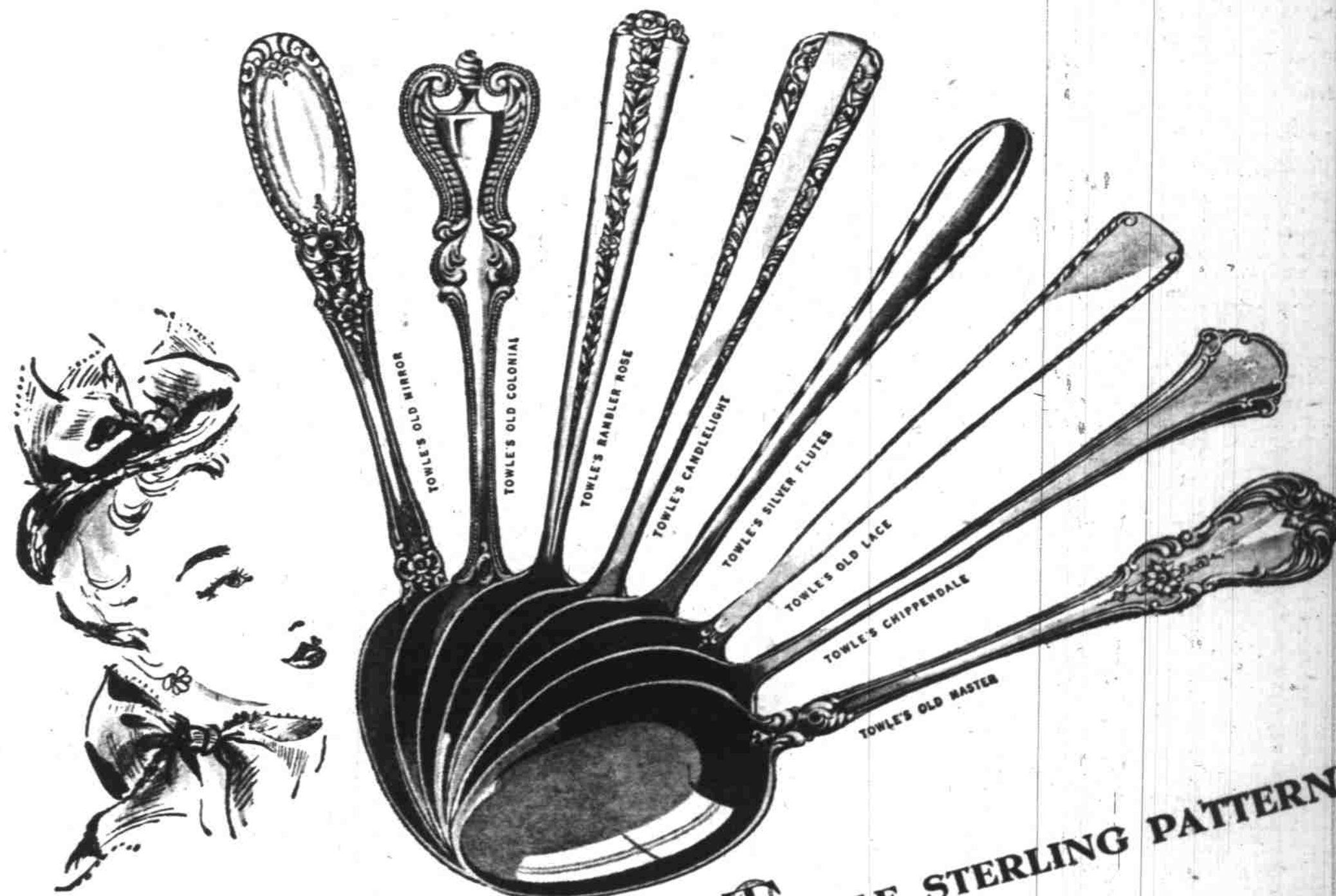
