

Woman Hurt In Auto Wreck Near Silverton

Mrs. Arden Willie Straw, Salem route 9, was reported in good condition by Salem General hospital attendants late Wednesday night after an auto accident earlier at Warner corner, at the intersection of the North Howell and Silverton roads, 5 miles west of Silverton.

The accident was a collision of cars driven by Mrs. Straw's husband and by Harry Leland Miller, Salem route 8, investigating state police said. Mrs. Straw and her son and daughter were all taken by Salem ambulance to Salem General hospital where the children received treatment for minor cuts and bruises and were dismissed, police said. Mrs. Straw's injuries were undetermined.

Police said the cars involved received only minor damage and that there were no other injuries.

State Makes Milk Labels Compulsory

Provisions to make compulsory grade A labels and to recognize a third milk grade, C, were issued in new dairy regulations by the state division of foods and dairies Wednesday and notices have been sent concerning the revisions to milk plants throughout Oregon, the state department of agriculture announced.

No grade A milk without a label may be sold in Oregon after September 1, Kenneth E. Carl, assistant chief of the division of foods and dairies, state agricultural department declared in announcing revised grades and standards of quality for fluid milk and milk products.

The new C grade milk will be a degraded item, Carl said, except that it may be marketed when there is not a sufficient supply of grades A and B milk to meet consumer demands. This situation, officials said, is again developing in some sections of the state. However, all grade C milk sold must conform to standards of sanitation set forth in the revised regulations, and officials said these standards are adequate to protect the consumer.

Other regulations covered by the new directives to dairymen include compulsory labeling of raw and pasteurized milk, whether reconstituted or recombinated; name and address of producer if raw milk and of the plant if pasteurized, and if vitamin D milk, the source of vitamin D units per quart.

A year's grace period is provided in the regulations to comply with providing a lip protector cap for all milk sold and the use of closed vans in hauling milk, except where the farmer does his own hauling.

The revised regulations also provide for larger milk houses and a tightening of bacteria count of raw milk. They also have changed the state standards for milk and cream used for manufacturing to the off-the-bottom method for sediment testing of cream. This is the same method used for testing of milk at present.

Russia, Slavs Hold Unity on Trieste Issue

LAKE SUCCESS, Aug. 4-(AP)—Despite cominform attacks on Marshal Tito, Soviet Russia and the Ukraine backed Yugoslavia today in a fight with the west over Trieste.

There was not the slightest sign in the United Nations security council of the rift in communist circles caused by the blasts of the communist information bureau against the head of the Yugoslav state.

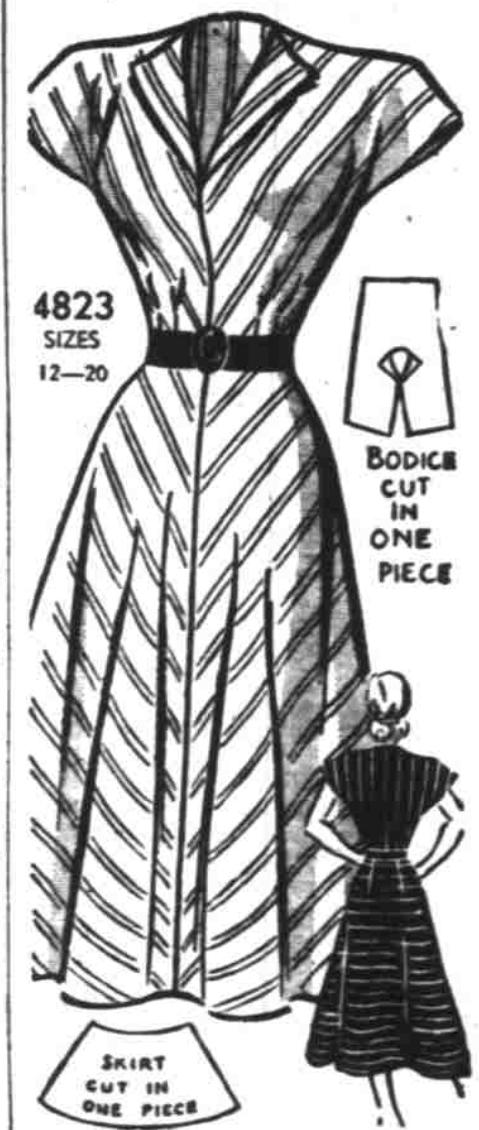
It was the first clear-cut indication here that the party struggle had not dented the solid Slav front in conflicts with the outside world.

Yugoslavia brought up the council fight by charging the United States and British with violating the Italian peace treaty. Dr. Joza Vilfan, Yugoslav delegate, declared the western powers were trying to make their zone of the Trieste territory a province of Italy.

Dr. Phillip C. Jessup, United States deputy, and Sir Alexander Cadogan, Britain, replied that Yugoslavia had no foundation for the charges.

Dr. Jessup called them "flimsy" and "utterly devoid of substance." He said the U. S. is proud of its record in Trieste.

Proponents of City Commission Aim for November Ballot Spot

Assertions that a city commission form of government in Salem would be more representative of the public and would save the taxpayers money were emphasized Wednesday night by members of a citizens' committee seeking to abolish the present city manager government.

Chairman Lloyd F. LeGarie, a labor temple that enough dissatisfaction with managerial government has been voiced in Salem to warrant the proposed ballot measure for city commission government.

The plan endorsed by his committee and drawn up by Attorney Elmer Amundson would, if a majority of voters approve in November, replace the city manager, mayor and seven-man council now administering the city with a city commission of three members all to serve full time.

Amundson said the city commission plan backed by LeGarie's committee is a composite of several city commission governments operating in cities elsewhere, drawn up to preserve "checks and balances in local government," and to meet objections in Salem that a city manager government "is too dictatorial."

Salaries Listed A mayor-commissioner would receive \$5,500 annual salary and two other commissioners \$5,000. Their combined salary of \$15,500 would exceed the present city manager salary of \$9,000 on the face of it, said LeGarie, but in practice the commissioners would probably absorb the duties of two or three present paid department heads.

LeGarie gave as an example the case of a qualified engineer elected to the commissioner's post for public works and property. Such a man, LeGarie averred, would himself handle the post of city engineer but would receive only his commissioner's salary. The proposed charter change does not make mandatory such a combination, however.

Divides Departments The proposal divides present city departments into three groups, each to be administered by one of the commissioners. A commission of public affairs and finance, headed by the mayor-commissioner would embrace departments of treasurer, recorder, planning commission, civil service commission, library and housing authority.

A commission of public health and safety would include police, fire and health departments and boxing commission. Within the commission of public works and property would be departments of water, engineer, building inspector, street superintendent, park superintendent, sewers and airport.

To Hold Meeting The commissioners would meet together, as the present city council does, to establish general policy and to decide matters involving more than one commission or "the public or specific persons or property."

A new charter provision of the

former city council member, told referendum measure would specify among commissioner's duties the "duty to reorganize and coordinate the work of the various departments to reduce the operating expenses."

Both city attorney and city judge would be elected officials, operating independently of the commissions, under the proposal. The attorney would be paid \$5,000 and the judge between \$2,700 and \$5,000 depending on how much time would be required for him to fulfill his duties. Under the present system, the attorney's salary of \$5,160 must cover also his stenographic help and the judge is paid \$2,700 in the general understanding it is about a half-time job.

Require Vote Any salary changes for the elected officials or realignment of the commission duties would require a vote of Salem citizens. The city budget would be drawn by the commission and a citizens' budget committee, as at present.

The only paid city officials now elected are city judge and city treasurer. City civil service now affects only police and fire departments, but would cover all but the elected officials and employees under the proposed change. If sufficient (1,262) valid signatures are obtained on petition for the referendum and voters adopt the charter changes in the November general election, the new city government would be formed by a special city election February 8 and all terms of office would begin March 1, 1949.
