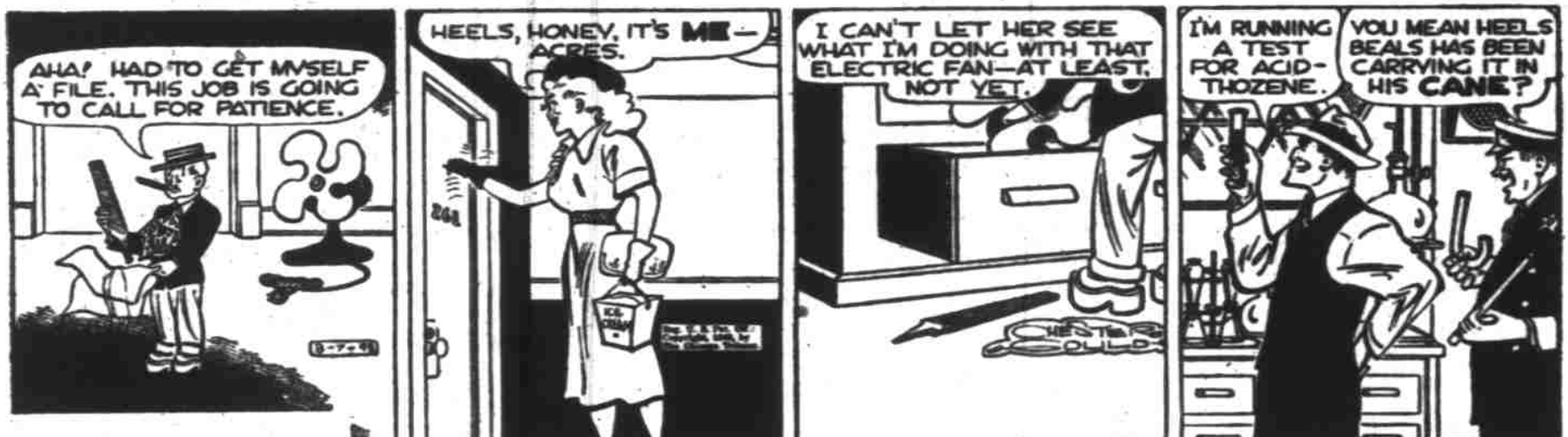

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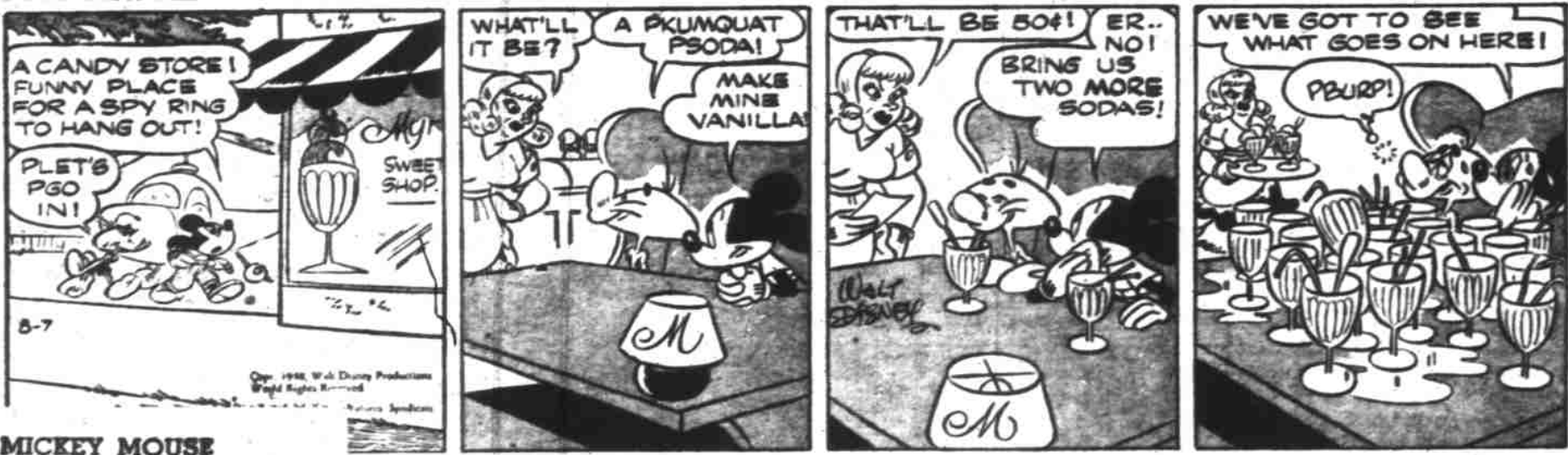
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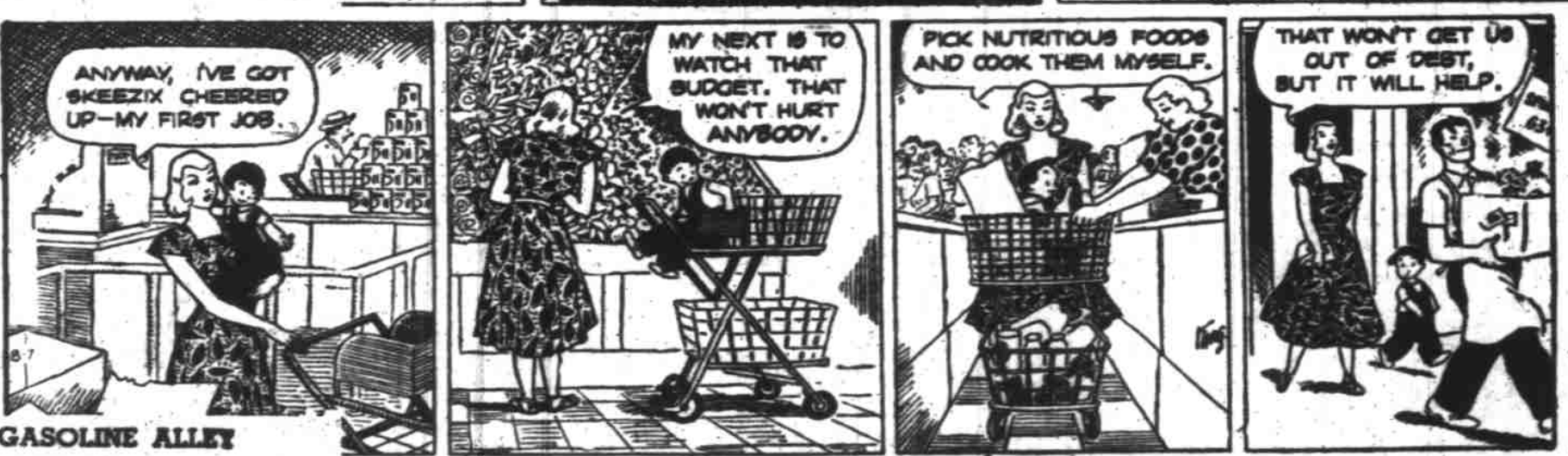

Stock Market Trading Tight

NEW YORK, Aug. 6 (P)—Speculative and investment interest approached the vanishing point in today's stock market. Most prices showed only fractional variations from the previous close. Trading volume dropped to the lowest level in five months or so. There was a lot of good news and a sprinkling of bad. But Wall Street shrugged off the latest developments and sat back to outwait congress and Moscow. The market has displayed much the same attitude most of the week. Volume failed to cross the 900,000-share mark each day, which amounts to lean pickings for brokerage houses after some fast sessions earlier this year. Wednesday was the only day the market managed to work up any steam at all. A fairly substantial advance on that day put the market on the plus side for the week. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks remained at 69.

Wheat, Corn Prices Rally

CHICAGO, Aug. 6 (P)—Grains snapped out of their slow downward trend today, wheat and corn rallying briskly on short-covering. The short-covering movement got under way around mid-way in the session. Before it started, September corn had sunk to another new seasonal low. The rally seemed to be based on the theory that grains were oversold. Wheat closed 1 1/2-2 1/2 higher, September \$2.23 1/4-5/8; corn was 2 1/2-2 3/4 higher, September \$1.64 1/4-1/2; oats were 1/4-1/2 higher, September 72 1/2; rye was 3 cents higher, December \$1.70, and soybeans were 2 1/2 to 4 cents higher, November \$2.71 1/4.
