Santiam 4-H Clubbers Plan for Fall Shows

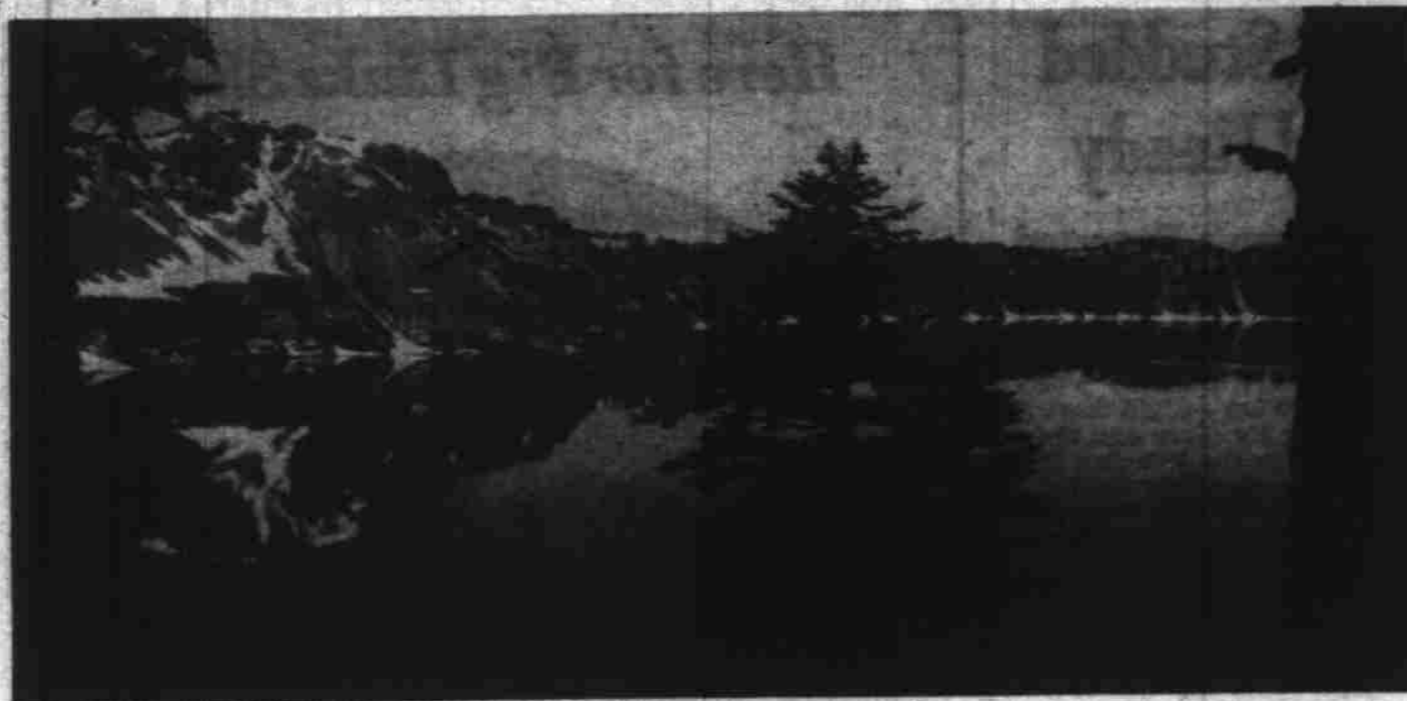

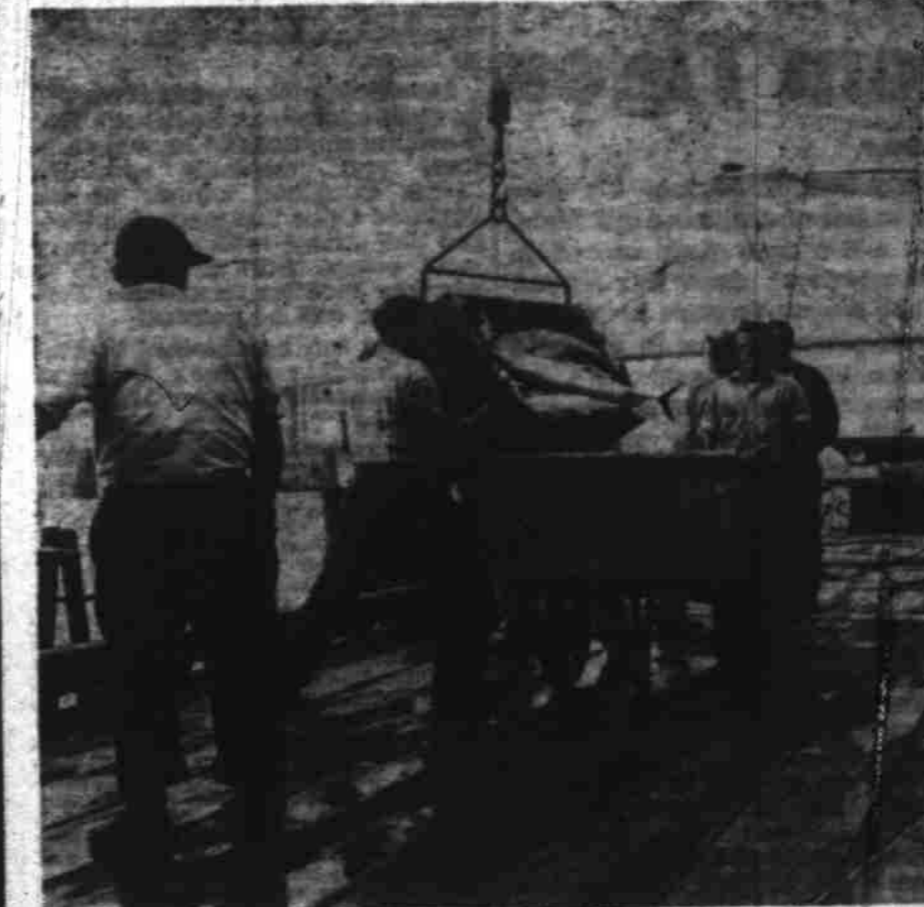

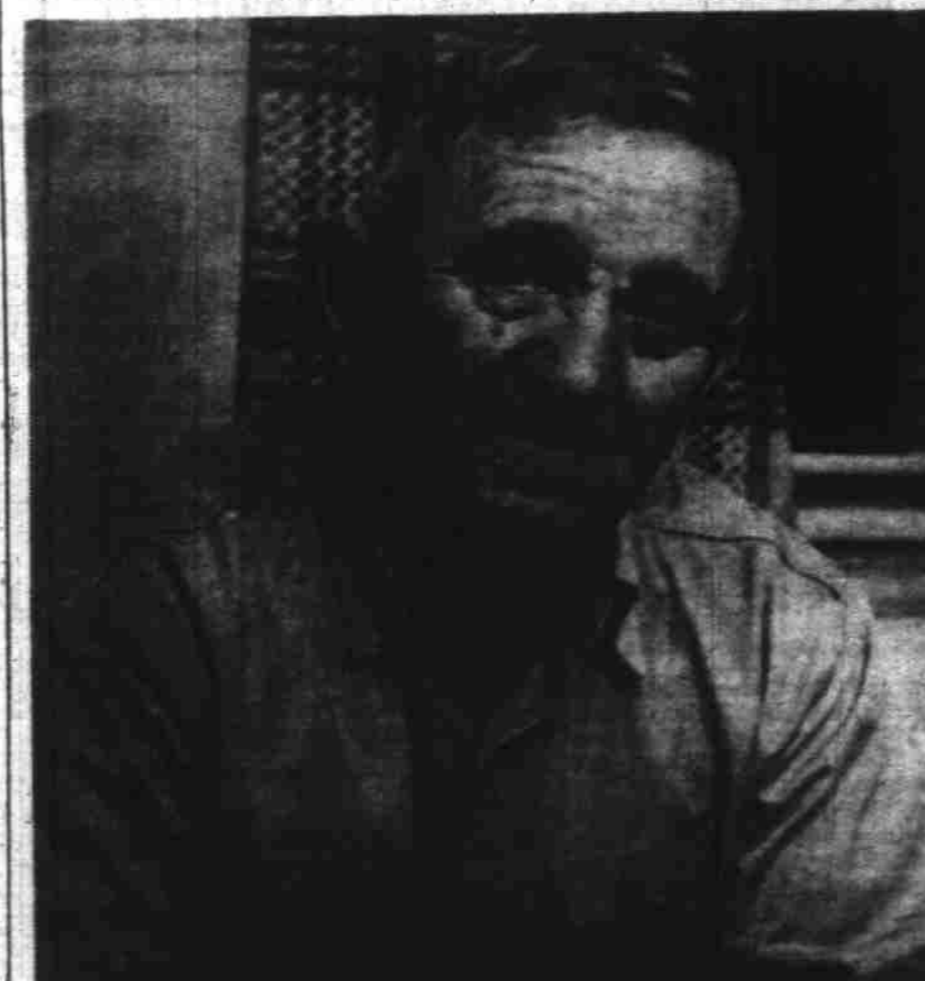
