## Dr. Robert Baron Is Appointed to OCE Staff

MONMOUTH—Dr. Robert B. D. Baron, who has been visiting instructor at Oregon College of Education for the summer session, has been appointed Assistant Professor of Psychology and Education on the regular staff at OCE. Receiving his Master of Education degree at the University of Alberta, Dr. Baron was teaching assistant in Education and Psychology and Assistant Director of the Testing Bureau at the University of Southern California where he won his Ph.D. in June, 1948.
