SPOKANE, Aug. 7-(P)—A medal awarded by the king of Norway will be presented to E. B. Hauke of Minneapolis, supreme president of the Sons of Norway lodge, at a ceremony in Spokane August 14. The presentation will be made by Christian A. Stang, Norwegian consul in Seattle. The decoration, "commander of the Order of St. Olaf with star" recognizes aid given the Norwegian people by the fraternal order.

Navy Training Plane Crashes, Bodies Found

LAKE CITY, Fla., Aug. 7-(P)—A navy plane crashed and burned southeast of Houston between Lake City and Live Oak tonight, the Florida highway patrol reported.

Lt. T. J. Riley of the highway patrol said first reports indicated that at least three persons were dead. He said that many bodies had been counted by searchers who reached the scene.

The wreckage was still burning when a party of highway patrolmen and sheriff's deputies reached it, the highway patrol said. At Jacksonville, the navy said the ship was a two-engine trainer. It left there this morning on a passenger flight to Pensacola and left the west Florida city shortly before 7 o'clock tonight.

It was due back in Jacksonville shortly after 9 o'clock. Officers said they thought four persons were aboard. The craft normally carries five.

Names of those on the plane will not be released until the next of kin have been notified.

Reds 'Rescue' Woman from White Russians

VALLEY COTTAGE, N. Y., Aug. 7-(P)—A 52-year-old Russian woman school teacher tonight became the storm center of a Russian tug-of-war that ranged from here to the New York City Soviet consulate with repercussions in Washington.

The woman, identified as Kosenkina Oksana Stepanova, was driven away today from Reed farm, operated here by Countess Alexandra Tolstoy, youngest daughter of the Russian novelist, as a White Russian retreat.

In New York, Soviet Consul General Jacob Lomakin said she had been "rescued" from the farm after White Russians forcibly took her there to keep her from returning to the Soviet Union.

But Countess Tolstoy said Mrs. Stepanova had come to Reed farm because "she believed she was going to be shot," and went back to New York with the Soviets today saying "if they shoot me, maybe it is the best way out."

Later, in Washington, Rep. Mundt (R-SD) said the school teacher was going to tell the house un-American activities committee, of which he is acting chairman, all about Russian aggression.

Mundt said she was being held in the New York consulate against her will and the FBI was investigating to see if there was a kidnapping.

Chapman Leads In Kentucky Vote For Senate Contest

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Aug. 7-(P)—Rep. Virgil Chapman of Paris took a commanding lead over his nearest opponent for the democratic senatorial nomination tonight as returns came in from the rural areas of Kentucky.

John Young Brown of Lexington, who led earlier with large pluralities piled up in organized labor strongholds, trailed by more than 11,000 votes with more than half the state's 4,057 precincts reported.

The unofficial count in 2,081 precincts was: Chapman, 80,162; Brown, 49,057 and Milton E. Whitworth, Elizabethtown, 7,406.

Senator John S. Cooper of Somerset was assured the republican senatorial nomination. Unofficial returns from 2,064 precincts gave Cooper 30,598 to 2,738 for his only opponent, Silas A. Sullivan of Jamestown.
