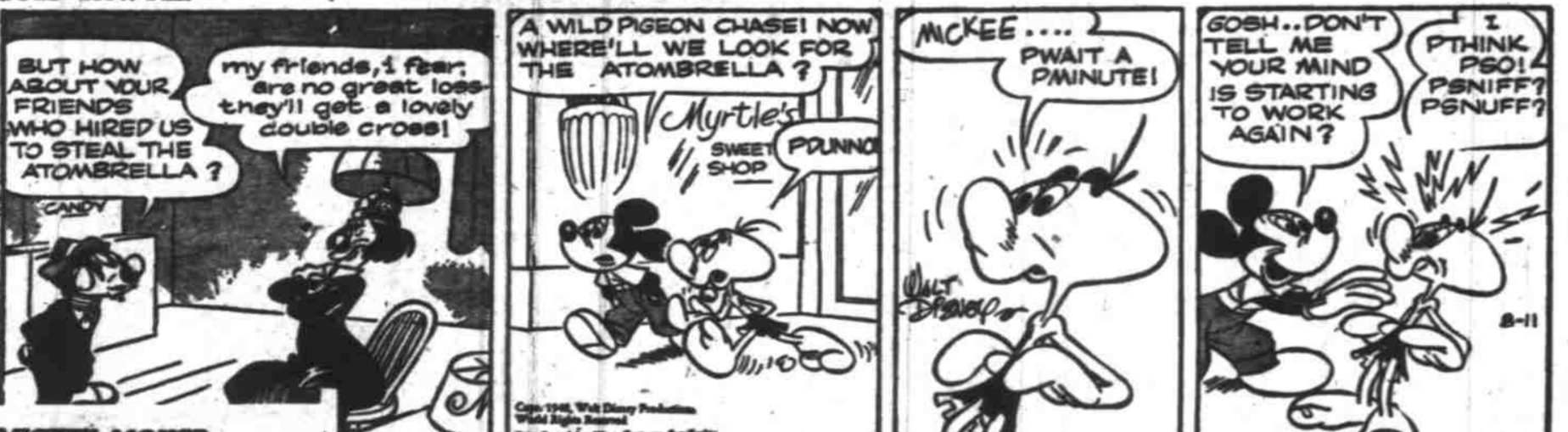

Corn Prices Continue Sag

CHICAGO, Aug. 10 (AP)—Liquidation in the corn pit influenced price action at the board of trade today. Corn was easy at the opening and continued to sag, as traders prepared for an optimistic government estimate of the condition of crops as of August 1.

Corn advanced from the day's low toward the finish and at the close, wheat was 2 1/2 higher to 3/4 lower than the previous finish, September \$2.21 1/4-3/4. Corn was 1/2 to 2 cents lower; September \$1.60-1.59 1/4. Oats were 3/4 to 1/2 lower, September 72-73 1/4. Rye was 1 1/2 to 2 cents lower, December \$1.67 1/4, and soybeans were 1/4 lower to 1 cent higher, December \$2.63 1/4.

Stocks Sink to 3-Month Low

NEW YORK, Aug. 10 (AP)—The stock market dropped to the lowest average level in more than 3 months today when a last-minute expansion in selling quickened an earlier downturn. Final prices were off fractions to 2 points or more.
