Traffic Rules, Dam Pondered At Silverton

SILVERTON, Aug. 21 — New traffic ordinances at Silverton to conform with state laws, authorization of the purchase of water pipes and discussion of improvement for the local water system occupied four members of the city council at a special meeting Thursday night.

Present were Mayor C. H. Dickerson, councilmen C. H. Weiby, Robert Allen and Errol Ross, City Manager Robert Borland and City Attorney Rex Albright. Absent were Alvin Legard, Alfred Adams and George Christensen.

Two ordinances, passed on first reading Thursday night, regulate

traffic at Silverton to conform with state traffic laws, including making it unlawful to drive on Silverton streets while intoxicated.

The city manager was authorized to buy 600 feet of 12-inch wood pipe to be used on the trunk line to the reservoir, and 2,000 feet of four- and six-inch to be used in the Northside addition. Pipe lines in these areas need replacing so badly, Manager Borland explained, that waiting for cast iron pipe could scarcely be continued. Added to the standing order were Mill and Oak street lines.

Construction of a new dam for Silverton was also discussed favorably although no action was taken. Additional information is to be obtained by the September 6 meeting. Construction has been recommended by the city planning commission. Silverton's water situation has been serious this summer both from lack of proper pipe and from supply. In former years Silverton had a dam on Abiqua creek which went out in early war years and was not replaced because of lack of materials and labor.
