Kleinke Named Director of Meat Dealers

Emmett Kleinke, proprietor of the State Street market, has been notified of his election as a director of the National Association of Retail Meat Dealers at the annual convention earlier this month in Chicago.

The association is one of the oldest food trade associations in the United States, having been organized in 1885. It represents some 20,000 independent retail meat dealers.

Kleinke has been in the retail meat business in Salem for 20 years and for the past 12 years has operated the State Street market. He also is a director of the Oregon Independent Retail Meat Dealers association.

Kleinke attended a war emergency convention in Chicago in 1945 and served as a committee member of retail meat dealers representing the national association in dealing with wartime agencies such as the OPA and the war food administration.

Kleinke is scheduled to appear at a regional meeting of the Washington State Retail Meat dealers association in Seattle September 19 and 20.

Engineering Employes Unite, Aim to Hold Personnel in State

State engineering employes met Friday night at Salem Chamber of Commerce to form the Association of Engineering Employes of Oregon, whose object is to assist in preventing highly trained engineering personnel of Oregon from migrating to other states where higher salaries are reportedly paid for identical positions. About 400 state employes were said to be eligible for the group.

Newly-elected president E. G. Ricketts, bridge investigator; engineer for the state highway department in Salem, said Saturday that the high rate of turnover in engineering personnel of the state is costing a tremendous amount of money, both in cost of training new personnel and in losing the services of well-trained men.

Ricketts explained that in the present, period of expanded state construction programs the many new graduate engineers in the state colleges are needed for positions now vacant in engineering and to augment the pre war force of engineers.

Officers elected at the first meeting were Ricketts, president; first vice-president, Forrest Cooper, assistant division engineer; second vice-president, J. T. Skelton, resident bridge engineer of Portland; secretary-treasurer, Claude E. Pfifer, engineer designer, Salem.

Seven directors elected are Ed Pease, construction office engineer, Salem; C. A. Gardner, assistant bridge officer; Oscar Cutler, highway planning engineer; D. J. Bardee, resident highway engineer of Portland; Tom Edwards, district maintenance superintendent at Klamath Falls; C. D. Cannon, division office engineer at LaGrande, and Clay Cornett, resident highway engineer at Portland.

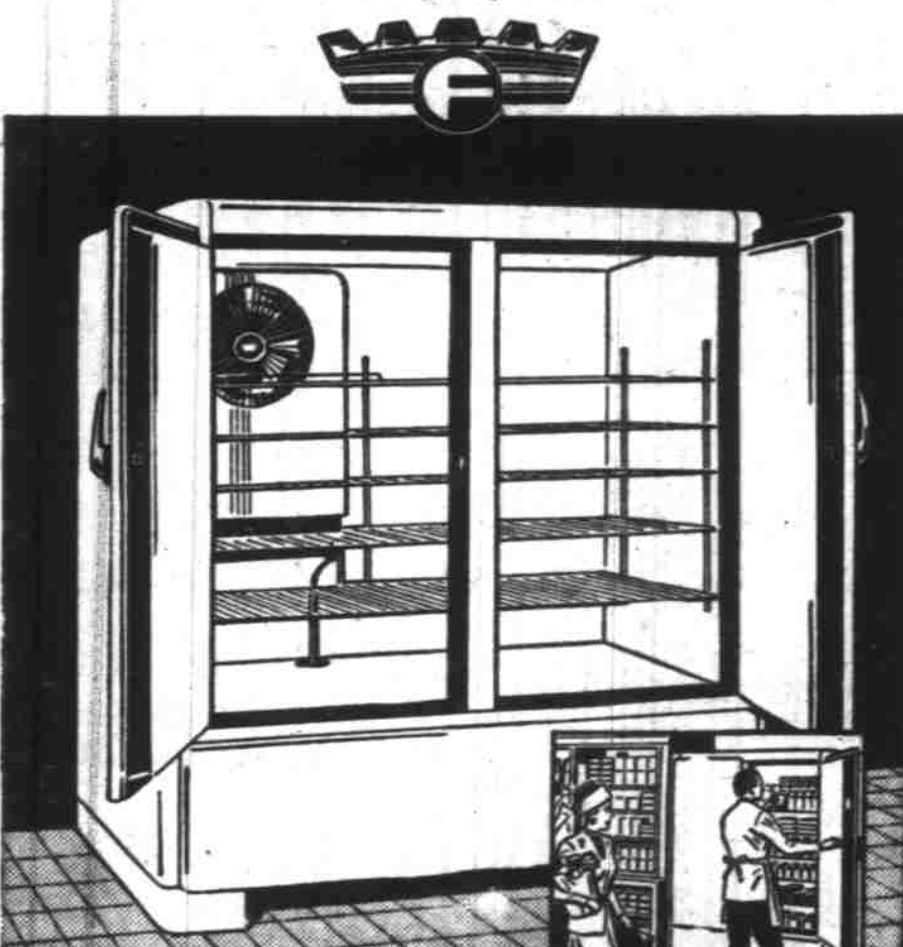
