Salem Marine Unit Trainees Fire Howitzers

By Don Hill Staff Writer, The Statesman WITH SALEM'S MARINE RESERVE UNIT AT CAMP PENDELTON, Calif., Aug. 27 (Special)—Admit the barren, dried hills of Camp Pendleton in southern California Salem's Marine reservists got their first taste of gun powder Friday as the battery fired 200 rounds of ammunition during their first actual firing of 105 mm. howitzers.

After three days of intensive training on the huge field pieces the 75 men and officers of C battery, here for 15 days training, were first led through practice firing by regular marine cannonniers. The event was particularly thrilling for the Salem men because few have ever had any experience with artillery.
