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It's a Wise Hen Who . . .

Nature moves in mysterious ways its lessons to impart to man. Wisdom from the mouths of babes, in the ways of insects and the instinctual habits of animals has been revealed again and again. But who would have suspected that the industrious hen, scratching on the chicken coop floor, would lead scientists to discover a way to treat pernicious anemia in human patients?

Investigators from American Cyanamid's Lederle laboratories decided that chicken foraging among the litter on a hen house floor were looking for something more than stray grains of barley, the Wall Street Journal reports. They found the birds were getting an unidentified vitamin (that improved hatchability) produced from fermentation of matter on the floor.

This vitamin, "animal protein factor," was found to resemble essences in purified liver extract, used by doctors to treat pernicious anemia. It is thought to be related to the Vitamin B family. Using the chicken coop bacteria as a guide, the researchers found they could make a bacterial extract similar to the liver extract. In at least two experiments on human patients the new discovery has proved successful.

Since it appears that animals have a purpose to almost everything they do, it might be wise for the scientists to study the hen further. Who knows what significant discovery they might stumble upon after ascertaining why it is that a chicken always crosses the road in the path of a speeding car!

Roseburg Likes Manager

Roseburg is getting a new swimming pool, and getting it at low cost largely through the efforts of its city manager. Roseburg is another late comer to the ranks of cities with city managers. Certainly if the report in the News-Review is correct people there must be very happy both over the form of city government and the man engaged as city manager.

When estimates of contract cost of a pool ran to \$125,000 the manager took the \$53,000 on hand and personally supervised building the pool. The pool is finished but dressing rooms to cost about \$15,000 are still to be built. The Roseburg paper estimates that the manager has saved on this one project alone the expense of his office for almost six years.

Salem's city manager took the same course on construction of an interceptor sewer. When the lone bid ran far out of line with estimates he recommended that the city build the line itself. Actual construction has been deferred until next year; but it is quite probable that large savings will be realized. On other city projects the manager has also effected savings to the city.

As the people of Salem become aware of these facts we have little doubt they will refuse to upset the manager plan, now in operation about 20 months.

From Sagebrush to Grass

The Rotary club at Lakeview sponsored a project recently which may bring about a great change in the high range country. It rounded up people from the state college, soil conservation service, bureau of land management, implement dealers and farmers and a demonstration was staged of clearing land of sagebrush. The idea is to clear the land, seed it to grass which will support more cattle or sheep.

Visitors to the highlands who see the wide expanse of sagebrush may conclude that this was the original cover. Except in the drier parts this was not the case. There were broad expanses of bunch grass which makes fine forage for livestock. Overgrazing killed off the bunchgrass and the more hardy sagebrush took its place.

Modern power equipment can clear sagebrush easily, and flamethrowers are good for burning it off. Then if proper methods of conservation are followed it may be possible to augment greatly the output of meat and wool from these millions of acres in eastern Oregon.

New Process for Casting Steel

For years steel companies have been experimenting to see if they could eliminate some of the steps in its manufacture. Now Republic Steel and Babcock & Wilcox, the latter an equipment manufacturer, announce perfecting a process by which semi-finished steel may be made by pouring directly from the open-hearth furnace. If this proves practical in trial it will make possible doing away with dunking ingots in soaking pits, then conveying it to blooming mills where the ingots pass through great rollers to come out as semi-finished steel.

Besides reducing the cost of production the process may make possible decentralization of steel-making. Ingots may be bought from steel mills and then cast into semi-finished cylinders for subsequent shaping. This makes unnecessary the heavy investment in blooming mills which ties steel so closely to the great centers of steel-making.

Here is another frontier that has been penetrated by American inventive genius. Anything that can reduce the cost of steel is most welcome for our economy.

The Albany Democrat-Herald has published a 64-page issue to recognize Albany's centennial. The number is filled with excellent articles recounting the history of the Albany community and of Linn county; and is well supported by advertising of local business establishments. The Democrat-Herald is a consolidation of two struggling dailies, effected in 1925 by W. L. Jackson and Ralph Cronise who had acquired the Democrat in 1919. It has advanced with the community it serves, its latest step forward being the purchase of a new 16-page curved plate press. The Statesman notes with friendly interest the progress of the D-H and of Albany, the "Hub City."

Bear stories have been legion in the northwest this year. There was the one about the little girl that was carried off by a bruin. And locally we had the cougar scare. Well, in Vermont they usually have tales of panthers and of bears but the best they could do this year was to report that an irate chipmunk attacked a peaceful man. This gives us cause to be more leery of these squirrels in the capitol park. One of them eyed us rather balefully just the other day. . . .

Looks like local walnut growers can get ready to reap a pretty penny this fall. The Wall Street Journal reports that carryover stocks are at the lowest ebb since the war and distributors are sold out. That means high prices. And this time last year the domestic industry was weeping buckets about the threat of foreign competition!

German Pastor Slated Here By Lutherans

The Rev. Heinrich Falk, pastor of St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran church at Frankfurt-on-Main, Germany, will speak at Christ Lutheran church, State and 18th streets, Tuesday at 8 p.m.

The Rev. Mr. Falk is on a leave of absence and is traveling through this country on a lecture tour sponsored by the National Lutheran council.

In his lecture here, he will tell about the life in his congregation from the time he became pastor in 1934 until the church and parsonage were destroyed during World War II. Only portion left intact by the bombing was a statue of Christ, harmed only by the breaking off of its hands.

This reportedly inspired the oft-quoted poem, "Christ has no hands but our hands to do His work today."

He returned from a vacation in southern California, and Dr. Kirby will be in his pulpit Sunday morning at Jason Lee Memorial Methodist church.

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Mrs. Gregory Leaves Church

Mrs. Cora E. Gregory will complete three years' ministry at Highland Avenue Friends church Sunday and is to evangelistic work. She will be succeeded here on September 5 by the Rev. Edward Harmon.
