## Chest X-Ray Retakes End

Retakes in the Marion county chest x-ray survey which ended Wednesday, will be snapped at the mobile truck x-ray unit on the county courthouse grounds here Monday.

More than 2,000 workers in Salem industries received free x-rays since August 6, the Marion County Tuberculosis and Health association reported. Last spring 9,033 x-rays were taken in this county.
