



"And we know that we can operate on land, sea and in the air. The air force general, commanding Alaskan armed forces, told a news conference that newlycompleted Eielson field near Fairbanks is capable now of maintaining an aerial offensive with the new B-50 bomber, which is Boeing's largest version of the wartime B-29.

Arctic Military

Move Also Cold

Twining, air commander in the Solomons during the war, expressed belief that American forces "now can operate as well, if not better, than anyone else" under Arctic conditions.

Have Same Problems
"We do know that the Russians have the same problems as we have," he said, "They put on their pants one leg at a time the same as we do."

Twining said the air forces have a full group now of jet fighters -about 75 improved F-80's-operating in Alaska. He added that a group of long-range B-50's will undergo Arctic training this win-

Twining and Rear Adm. Alfred E. Montgomery, commander of the Alasken sea frontier, are conferring at Pearl Harbor with Admiral D. C. Ramsey, commander in chief of the Pacific fleet.

Need Housing, Men The big problem of the armed forces in Alaska, said Twining is housing and manpower for basebuilding. Montgomery Wryly observed that Russia "as a dictatorship" does not have a manpower problem, as does the American democracy.

"The Russians can send construction workers where they need them," said Montgomery. "We can invite them." Just a 'Big One'

Asked about the size of Eielson field, 30 miles south of Fairbanks, Twining replied with a smile: "Just say it's a big one."

He said the United States has

developed a considerable number of Alaskan air fields from which B-29's can operate. Because of the weather and the terrain, Alaskan bases actually are like a series of islands "and the supply problem is a rough one." Year's Supply in 5 Days

In this connection, Montgomery said a full year's supply was put ashore at the Point Barrow oil development base by a navy amphibous force in only five days. This, added the admiral, was more tonnage on Point Barrow's beach than went ashore at Okina-

wa during the invasion phase

Twining said American forces are scrupulously observing the limits of approach to Russian territory, "and-so far as we knowthe Russians' are doing the same" (in regard to American territory.) "We'd like to know more aboutwhat's going on in Russian terri-tory," Twining concluded. "We are using all means we can to find out."
