

Traffic Safety List for Period

Bend and Klamath Falls are the only major Oregon cities with perfect traffic death records for the first six months of this year, accident summaries compiled by Secretary of State Earl Newbry revealed Saturday.

Salem traffic claimed two lives in the period, compared with three the year before.

Neither Bend nor Klamath Falls reported a single fatality during the period, and matched an equally spotless record established during the first half of 1947.

Death-free at the midyear of 1947, Eugene, Medford and Astoria were charged with a total of four fatalities as of last June 30.

Detailed summaries of the traffic accident experience for each the six cities are now being

Oregon cities in the 5,000 to 10,000 class reported a total of six deaths against seven for the previous year.

Most notable reduction was scored in Portland, where deaths decreased from 33 to 18 for a drop of 45 per cent.
