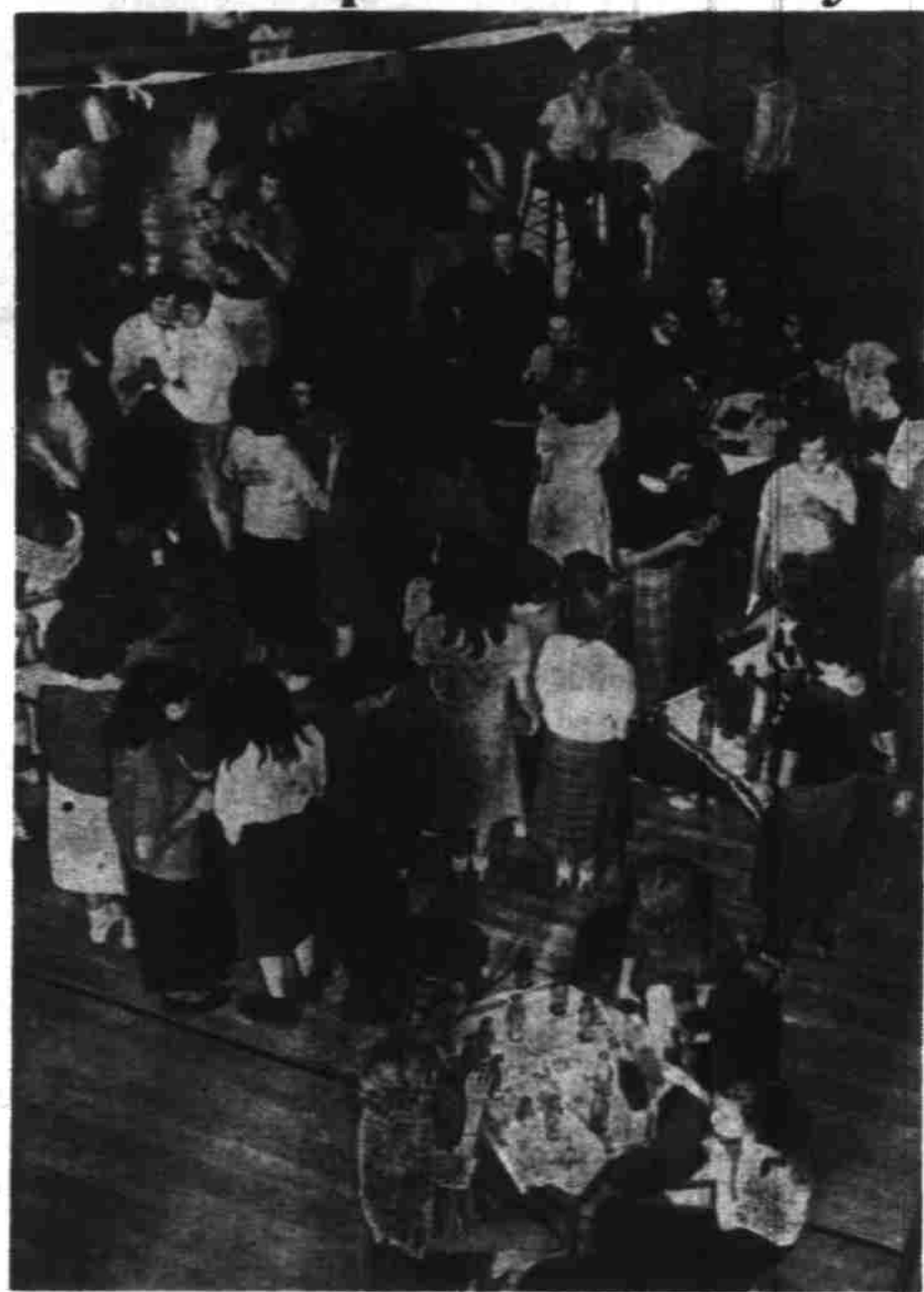


Leslie Pupils in First Party

Canada to Assist Food-Short Hawaii

HONOLULU, Sept. 27—(AP)—Short of food during the U. S. Pacific Coast maritime strike, Honolulu got word here from the Vancouver, B.C., Board of Trade that substantial quantities of vegetables, flour and salmon are available there for shipment.
