

24-inch Pipe Key to Water Line Addition

City crews are at work in north-east Salem laying a new water pipe line as part of an expanding city water system.

The newest link, for which 24-inch pipe is on the site ready to place underground, is from Center street, near 24th street, along 23rd and D streets, Park, Sunnyview and Evergreen avenues to Silverton road. Just to the east is one of the fastest - growing suburban areas.

There it will join a 16-inch main line to be laid along Silverton road from Beech to Evergreen avenue.

Already completed on the west end of this is the 16-inch pipe from Silverton road and Beech avenue along Beech, past the railway underpass to Cherry avenue and the Oregon Electric crossing. Until the new trunk line is finished, this is supplied by eight-inch pipes running along Portland and Silverton roads. It is anticipated that the 16-inch line will be extended eventually west to Front street to further equalize pressure in north Salem areas.

South End of Trunk
On the south end of the trunk, some work has already been accomplished. From 24th and Center streets, the new line will be joined next year, via 24th and Mill streets, to a 30-inch trunk which already extends as far as 21st and Mill streets from the main supply line at 12th street and Rural avenue.

Other main trunks through Salem extend from the main reservoir at Rural avenue and John street to the standpipe on Fairmount hill (30 inches), on Liberty street to Center (18 inches) and along North Capitol street (24 inches). These are interlinked by various - sized distribution mains. Until the eastern trunk is finished, its northern section will be supplied by these smaller mains. Upon its completion, the trunk will be the supply artery and will equalize the pressure throughout the system.

Filtration System Used

The city's water comes from an underground filtration system on

Stayton island, in the North Santiam river above Stayton. It traverses the 18 miles to Salem in a 36-inch pipe. As much as 15,000,000 gallons has gone through in a single day, the water department calculates.

Some work has been done during the past year in an effort to increase the line's capacity to 20,000,000 gallons per day. It is planned to make tests to determine the periods of maximum flow. Frasen said that the trends of statistics on water use can be projected into the future, so the city will not be caught short when residential and industrial expansion passes the present system's limits.

From the supply line, the water goes into storage in four locations - the 10,000 - gallon reservoir at Rural avenue and John streets, completed in 1938; the 50,000 - gallon standpipe completed about the same year on Fairmount hill; a 500,000 - gallon reservoir on Candalaria heights, finished in 1940, and a 250,000 - gallon standpipe higher on Candalaria heights, new this year.

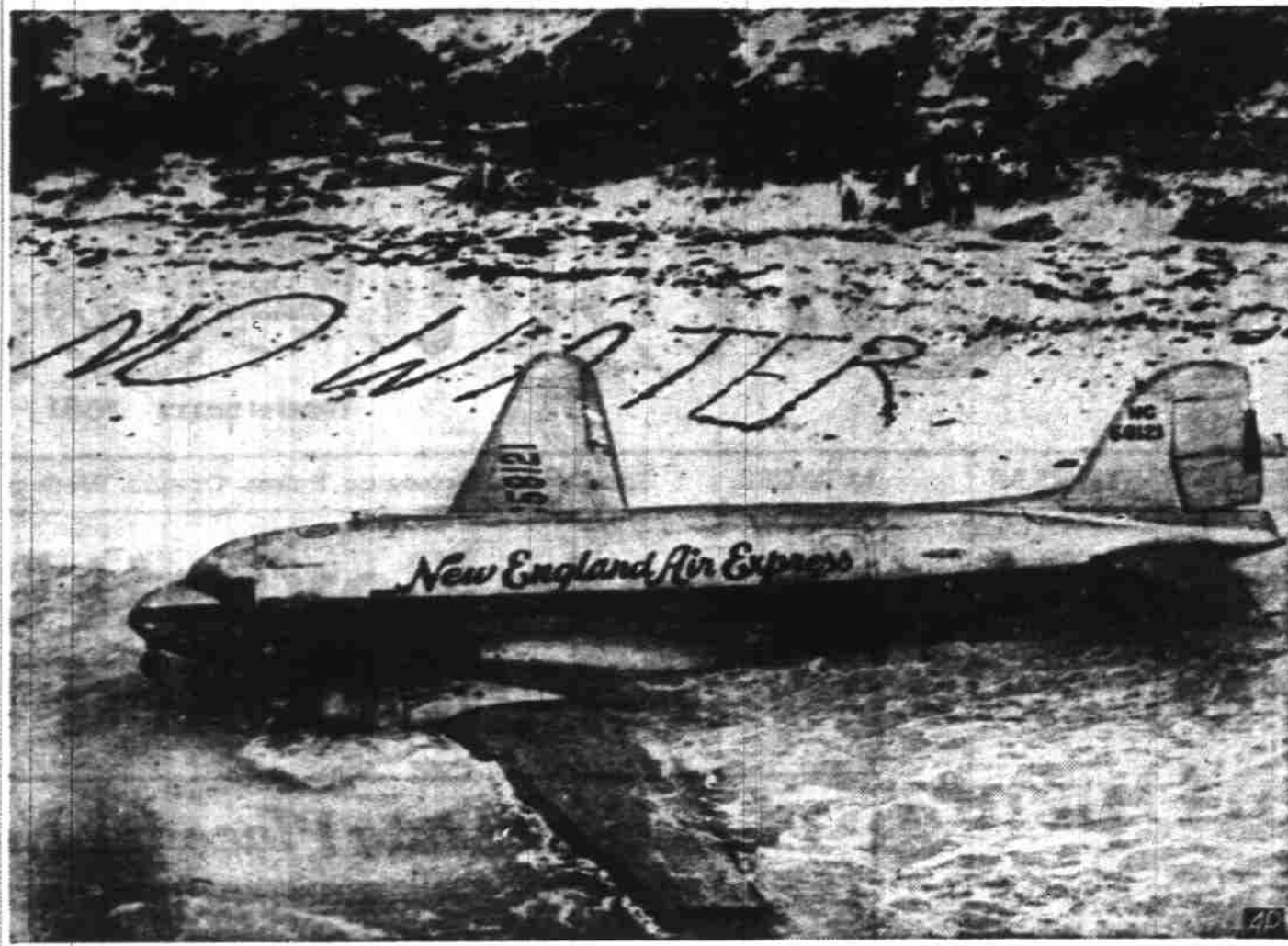
Schneider to Die in Colorado Gas Chamber

DENVER, Oct. 5 (AP)- Paul J. Schneider, former Marion county, Oregon, resident, will be executed in the Colorado state penitentiary lethal gas chamber the week of November 14, the state supreme court ruled today.

The court, by a 5 to 2 vote, upheld Schneider's conviction in a lower court on a first degree murder charge. The one time inmate of the Woodburn state training school was convicted of the kidnap-slaying of Frank J. Ford, Denver filling station operator.

He was arrested last October 22 at Pikeville, Ky., when he attempted to cash a check made out to Ford. He was also implicated in the kidnapping and murder of two business men, but that state released him to Colorado which has the death penalty. Authorities questioning Schneider found he had lived in several Marion county towns with his father who once resided at Salem route 1. He has a brother, Edward A. Schneider, and a sister, Mrs. Dorothy Haynes, both of Sherwood, and another sister, Mrs. Melvin Hubbard of Scotts Mills.

Page Urges U.S. Destroy Atomic Bombs

Kirby Page, internationally known lecturer in behalf of world peace, said Tuesday night that the United States must destroy her atomic bombs and work for disarmament if the entire world is to be saved from destruction.

Speaking twice before capacity crowds at the First Christian church, Page's subjects were: "Can Military Weapons Defend Us," and "What Does God Want Us to Do About Russia." His current national tour is being conducted under the auspices of the Quaker church's American Friends Peace Committee.

"There are two ways of resisting evil," Page said. "One is to meet evil with good; the other is to resist evil with good. At the present time we (Americans) are resisting Russian evil with a trust in atomic bombs and bacterial weapons. We are keeping up an armament race that will destroy us all."

The other way, and the road to peace, Page stated, is for Americans to be concerned about the Russians - be concerned about their economic well being and their safety.

"To do this, we must enlarge the Marshall Plan to help Russia also," Page advocated. "We must destroy our atomic bombs and bacterial weapons and put all our efforts into making an international treaty of disarmament; we must stop the mad arms race and help one another solve common problems."

Page, an ordained minister who has worked and lectured for world peace for more than 40 years, was introduced by Dr. Seth Huntington, pastor of the Salem First Congregational church.

Death Toll of Hunters Raised To 7 in Oregon

The death toll of hunters on this, the fifth day of the Oregon deer season, stands at seven.

The latest victim is Howard Sanders, 28, of Carson, who was fatally wounded Monday when a gun accidentally discharged as he was preparing to carry a deer. They were ten miles west of Copperfield in Baker county.

The brother-in-law, Dallas G. Wright, of Carson, told Coroner A. L. Schroeder he went for help, but when he returned a short time later Sanders, a truck driver for the Pine-Eagle cooperative creamery at Richland and Halfway, was dead.

One other hunter, Lloyd Sprague, Milwaukie, was killed by a hunter missing since Friday, in the rugged Buck mountain country, 40 miles west of Klamath Falls. Tuesday morning the Klamath Heriff's posse took 18 horses into the area to aid in the systematic search.

Clearing weather permitted resumption of the aerial search.
