Valley Sheep Breeders Still In Lead at PI

PORTLAND, Oct. 7-(AP)—Willamette valley breeders, who started out early in the week with the majority of winners in the sheep show at the Pacific International exposition, continued to dominate the sheep show through Wednesday's judging.

Ludie W. Matzen, Sherwood, won all awards for the Corriedales. Ahrens Brothers of Turner had a clean sweep in the Romney division. Honors were divided between Ahrens Brothers and Gath Brothers in the Suffolk, with Ahrens holding the champion ewe and Gath the grand and reserve champion ram. The two groups are both from Turner and are cousins. Gath Brothers also swept the Shropshire breed honors.

Swine champions were owned almost entirely by Oregon breeders with mid-Willamette valley winners including Austin F. Flegel, Sherwood, who had both grand championships on Duroc entries; Edwin Ridder, Sherwood, the junior champion Duroc sow; Arthur Franke & Son, Salem, all Spotted Poland China laurals.

William Riddell & Son of Monmouth had top animals in the Angora goat show.

As at the state fair, Canadian exhibitors dominated the Jersey cattle show at the Pacific International. Fairmead Farms, Milner, B.C., showed the grand, reserve and junior champion cows and the reserve champion bull. Quilchena farms, Vancouver, B.C., had the grand champion bull with Gordon Farms of Carlton, the junior champion bull.

C. E. Lewis, Aumsville, captured all awards but one in the dual purpose cattle division with his Red Poll animals. The senior champion bull was shown by Joe Lewis also of Aumsville.

Human Skin Lampshade In Ilse Koch Case Stolen

MUNICH, Germany, Oct. 6-(AP)—American war crimes officials reported today the disappearance of the tattooed—skin lampshades which had been tagged as evidence for the Ilse Koch case. Perhaps, they said, someone took them as souvenirs.

The officials said the question of whether the gruesome ornaments actually belonged to Frau Koch had never been determined. An army review board recently reduced her life sentence on war crimes charges to four years.

Bids Rejected on Springfield Plant

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6-(AP)—The war assets administration today rejected both bids for the Willamette wood chemical alcohol-from-wood-waste plant at Springfield, Ore.

The two offers came from the Waste Wood Chemical company of Milwaukee, Wis., and the Leach Brothers Co., Chicago. The WAA said the first company attached too many conditions to its bid for a five-year lease with an option to buy for \$1,200,000. The Leach Brothers' bid to buy the plant outright for \$51,000 was considered too low.

Oil Strikers, Police Clash

New violence marked the CIO oil workers strike against six California oil companies Wednesday.

Ten police officers were slightly injured when police and pickets clashed near the Standard Oil refinery at Richmond.

Several pickets were clubbed and eight were jailed. The pickets and police fought hand to hand, the police using their clubs and the pickets hurling rocks.

The disorders came when non-striking office employees sought to park their automobiles near the oil plant.

Six pickets were charged with inciting a riot, an offense punishable by two years in jail and a fine of \$2,000.

Deputy Sheriff Hired for North Santiam Area

Appointment of an additional deputy who will patrol the North Santiam area to strengthen that section's arm of the Marion county sheriff's office, was announced by Sheriff Denver Young Wednesday.

Laurence Merle Wright, 44, recently a member of the Silverton police force, has been appointed a deputy to patrol the Stayton-Detroit area starting Monday, Sheriff Young said.

Although Wright is to patrol

the Santiam River highway district daily from 6 p.m. to 2 a.m., he will work out of the sheriff's Salem headquarters office.

"The interests in the eastern portion of the county as well as other sections can best be served if the new deputy's duties are anchored in Salem," Sheriff Young said.

"When the demand becomes sufficient," Young said, "a deputy probably will be stationed in the Detroit area on a permanent basis."

Wright will operate in an auto equipped with a two-way radio. This will keep him in contact with the sheriff's, state police and Salem police offices. The new deputy was appointed as a result of recent petitions from residents in the Detroit-Idanha area for additional law enforcement.

Meat Price Trend Varies

CHICAGO, Oct. 6-(AP)—Hog prices were higher but beef was lower today. Live porkers moved 25 to 75 cents a hundred pounds higher, after having lost around \$5 during last week and this week until today. Beef animals were on the low side, with heifers and heavier weight steers 50 cents to \$1 less.

Some retail meat departments were following the market, announcing price cuts of anywhere from two to 20 cents in such widely separated sections as New York, Cincinnati, Philadelphia and Chicago.
