Britisher Predicts Trips to the Stars In Few Decades

LONDON, Oct. 9-(AP)-A British philosopher predicted tonight that man, if all goes well with the human race, will land on other planets of the solar system, "within a few decades."

But unless international relations improve, said Dr. W. Olaf Stapledon, man may blow his own planet into a string of asteroids and never know the thrill of voyaging in outer space.

Dr. Stapledon, a University of Liverpool lecturer, gave his views of the future in a prepared address for a British interplanetary society. He said it is "very unlikely" there are intelligent races on any other planets with the possible exception of Mars.


