At his death the property is to go to Jennings lodge No. 9, AF & AM, for a temple site; Elsie Diewert received \$3000 for unfeeling kindness to Mrs. Grant during her last illness; \$300 for upkeep of graves of relatives and friends.

The residue of the estate was left to the Shrine with the stipulation that all of it be used for the benefit of the Portland Shrine hospital for crippled children. Estimated value of the estate is \$42,000 personal property and \$5000 real property.
