

## Renovation At Livesley Building Starts

Work was started Tuesday on the \$100,000 alteration project on the ground floor of the T. A. Livesley building at State and Liberty streets, the future home of Stevens and Son, jewelers.

A \$25,000 permit for the first stage of the remodeling job was issued by the city engineer's office Tuesday to T. A. Livesley, Inc., owners of the building. O. W. Ingle is in charge of construction. Stevens firm, now located at 339 Court st., is expected to move into its new quarters about January 15. The company will occupy the entire 45 by 100 foot ground space. The remodeling work includes installation of "magic eye" doors, the first in Salem; application of black cararra glass entirely around two street sides of the building and installation of 12 show windows and modern glass doors on both sides.

Interior remodeling will entail dropping the high ceiling and installation of a huge dome, with indirect lighting, in the center. All partitions on the ground floor will be removed, as well as all bank fixtures with exception of the old vault.

Other permits issued by the city engineer Tuesday went to Edward Browning to alter a bathroom at 396 S. 19th st., at a cost of \$400, and to Mrs. Art Berry to reroof a house at 745 Trade st., \$75.
