WASHINGTON, Oct. 27 - (AP) John L. Lewis proposed today that President Truman use his control of the "money bags of the Marshall plan" to end the "shoot-out" of French coal miners who are hungry.

AFL President William Green, in Minneapolis, said he is "rather sympathetic" to Lewis' suggestion.

Housing Approved for Vanport Flood Refugees

PORTLAND, Oct. 27 - (AP) - Sen. Guy Cordon was notified today that the federal housing administrator, Raymond F. Foley, has approved additional housing for Vanport flood refugees.

Cordon's office in Washington, D.C., notified him that an FEA engineer would come here to survey the costs of remodeling Swan Island barracks for Vanport refugees now housed in trailers.

Oregon Steel Mill to Expand

PORTLAND, Oct. 27 - (AP) - Purchase of control of the Oregon Steel Mills, Portland, by the Gilmore Steel & Supply company, San Francisco, was announced here tonight.

A. G. Thies, vice - president of Gilmore, said the Oregon firm, a manufacturer of structural material, would remain as a separate operating firm. The details of the transaction were not disclosed.

The California company executive said the Oregon steel mill would be expanded.

"We feel the Pacific northwest holds one of the foremost possibilities in the United States," Thies added.

Greeting Card Firm to Move into Breyman Building

Second of four tenants for the Breyman building, undergoing remodeling at Court and Commercial streets, it was announced Wednesday, will be a greeting card business.

Lease for a 20 by 40 foot space facing Court street has been taken by Edward Williams, who has operated a similar business in Milwaukee, Wis., for 26 years.

The corner site will be occupied by Quisenberry's Central pharmacy, which expects to move in about December 1.

In addition to preparation for the stores, the exterior is being almost completely remodeled and modernized.

Infant Falls from Second-Story Window

Six-month-old Billy Killinger, 235 Hood st., was not much the worse Wednesday after a fall from a second-story window at his home about 8 p.m.

Billy received some minor cuts on his body as he fell through the window but was unshaken by the landing below. He was treated by Salem first aid men and pronounced in good shape.

Forest Fire Damage Small

Fires on state protected forest lands in Marion county burned only 2 1/2 acres during the 1948 fire season, Albert K. Wiesendanger, executive secretary of the Keep Oregon Green association, reported Wednesday.

Only two fires were reported on the lands during the year, the secretary stated in a letter of commendation to County Judge Grant Murphy, chairman of the county KOG committee.

French Strikers Block Coal Imports

PARIS, Oct. 27 - (AP) - Communist labor leaders today launched an all-out blockade of coal imports and tied up at least 22 ships in seven French ports. The ships, mostly American, had 200,000 tons of coal aboard. The blockade by dockers was called by the communist-led general confederation of labor to support the 23-day-old coal strike which has shut off 3,000,000 tons of coal from France's own mines.
