The state supreme court handed down a formal decision Thursday ruling that the Salem Electric franchise initiative should appear on the Salem city ballot Novem-

Last Friday the court ruled orally that the measure should remain on the ballot, but Thursday's opinion gave reasons for the deci-

The suit, brought in Marion county circuit court by Portland General Electric company, sought to enjoin County Clerk Harlan Judd and other county and city officials from placing the franchise proposal on the ballot. The measure would give Salem Electric, a cooperative, an unlimited franchise to supply power in Sa-

The opinion was written by Justice James T. Brand, and said Circuit Judge E. M. Page ruled properly when he dismissed the suit.
