Warrant Received For Clarence Little

A warrant from Kelso, Wash., charging Clarence Little with larceny was received by Marion County Sheriff Denver Young. Little is being held in Marion county jail awaiting grand jury action on charges of forgery, Sheriff Young said. Little is charged here with passing two bad checks in Stayton last August and is being held in lieu of \$1,500 bail. An additional bail of \$1,000 has been fixed under the Washington charge but no details of the complaint came with the warrant.

Dr. Purvine Named As Medical Examiner

Dr. Ralph E. Purvine, Salem physician, was appointed to the state board of medical examiners Thursday by Gov. John Hall. Dr. Purvine, state medical officer for selective service during the late war, succeeds the late Dr. Irvin I. Fox of Eugene.

State Police Total Arrests

State police during September arrested 3,446 persons for violations of motor vehicle laws and warned 6,901 others, a report showed Thursday. Fines and sentences growing out of the arrests totaled \$28,174 and the violators were given 3,296 days in jail. There were 77 arrests for driving while intoxicated, resulting in fines totaling \$6,120 and sentences adding up to 1,695 days in jail. In general law enforcement activities, officers arrested 397 persons who received \$4,916 in fines and 107 years in prison. Game violation arrests totaled 217 and fish violations 14.

PGE Denied Power to Sue In Vote Case

The state supreme court handed down a formal decision Thursday ruling that the Salem Electric franchise initiative should appear on the Salem city ballot November 2.

Last Friday the court ruled orally that the measure should remain on the ballot, but Thursday's opinion gave reasons for the decision.

The suit, brought in Marion county circuit court by Portland General Electric company, sought to enjoin County Clerk Harlan Judd and other county and city officials from placing the franchise proposal on the ballot. The measure would give Salem Electric, a cooperative, an unlimited franchise to supply power in Salem.

The opinion was written by Justice James T. Brand, and said Circuit Judge E. M. Page ruled properly when he dismissed the suit. It ruled that PGE had no legal capacity to ask for an injunction, stating that it is the duty of the district attorney to bring such a suit.

PGE claimed the cooperative failed to comply with the procedure in distributing and filing initiative petitions. It further claimed that competition with the cooperative would hurt PGE, but the court said this claim could not be considered.

Maudlin Heads WU Freshmen

Class elections at Willamette university were completed this week with the election of Lowell Maudlin, Bend, as freshman class

president. Seven of the nine members to the judiciary board were also elected during the balloting yesterday and Wednesday. Senior members elected were Leonard Maurer, Wenden, Idaho, and Gene Schmidt, Salem Juniors, Albert Miller, Hubbard, and Kenneth Holmes Albany. Donald Carpenter and Louis Prediletto were elected by the sophomore and freshman class respectively and Richard Endsley, Hood River, was selected to represent the Liberal Arts college.

To All Salem Voters

The proposed amendment which would replace our present city administration with three commissioners has five serious flaws, including this one:

Certain provisions of the proposed amendment are considered by able attorneys to be contrary to the State Constitution, and therefore unconstitutional. This means that if we adopted the commissioner form of city government, it would in all probability be set aside as a result of court action brought by any citizen who sought to contest its validity.

Cities all over the nation have tried and abandoned the commissioner form of government. We now have the type of city government a majority of us wanted. Let's keep it by voting 503 NO AGAINST THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT.
