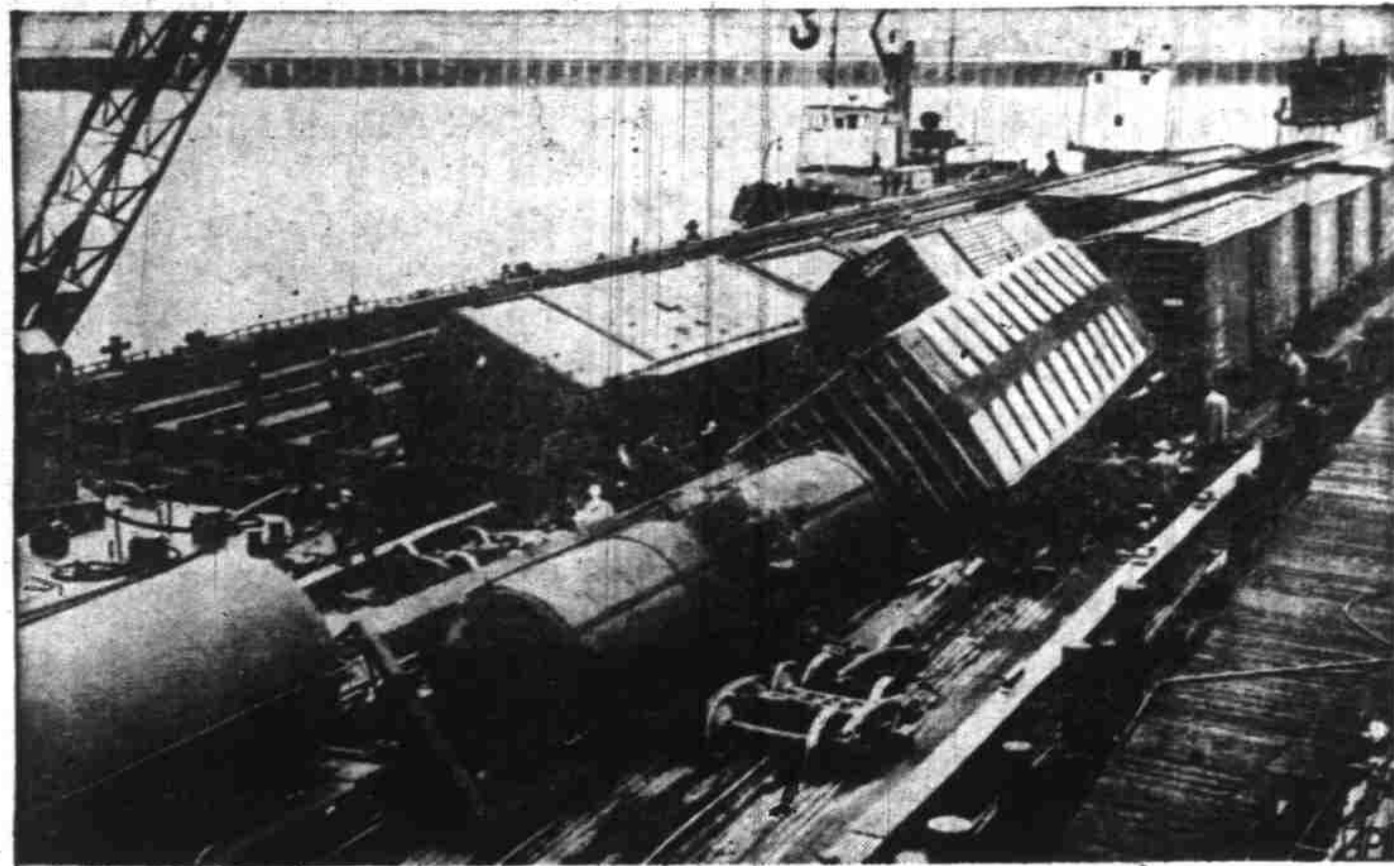


Freight Cars 'Jump Ship'

Jake Bird to Hang for Crime

OLYMPIA, Wash., Nov. 5—(AP)—The state supreme court ruled Thursday that Jake Bird negro transient who has confessed to nearly a dozen midwest slayings, must hang for murder of a Tacoma woman.

affirmed Bird's conviction of first degree murder. He was convicted in superior court of killing Mrs. Bertha Kludt with an axe and a knife.

Bird had contended in his appeal that his confession to the slaying was obtained under duress. The high court majority said the testimony of four witnesses "who heard the confession supports the position of the state that the confession was voluntary."

14 Nazi Sadists Hanged; One Given Reprieve

MUNICH, Germany, Nov. 5—(AP)—Fourteen Germans were hanged today but one accused of tearing scalp knots from the heads of concentration camp inmates won a reprieve. All were convicted of war crimes.

A U.S. army report said George Schallermaier, 53, a roll call leader at a Dachau subcamp, had tortured inmates by cutting their hair, "leaving a small portion in the center of their heads which he then pulled out" with his hands. The SS (Elite guard) man also was accused of exposing inmates to severe cold weather and beating them until they died.

Observing legal properties, the army in a statement today said: "A last minute petition was filed in his behalf, which the Eucom (European command) Judge Advocate General felt was of sufficient merit to warrant further investigation." Its details were not disclosed.

Ten of the 14 hanged today were accused of killing unarmed American fliers who had parachuted from disabled aircraft over Germany during the war. The other four were convicted of having committed concentration camp atrocities.
