Architect is Sidney B. Hayslip of Portland.

The church expects construction to start as soon as the bids are accepted, since the congregation must move within 18 months from its present home at High and Center streets. The new structure will be of reinforced concrete with brick exterior. Seating capacity will be 850, with overflow of 300.
