

# Chinese Ambassador Stresses Seriousness of Red Menace

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12—(AP)—Wellington Koo, the Chinese Ambassador, said tonight "the Communist menace in China is the gravest of its kind in any part of the world." The Ambassador's comment came a few hours after Senator Bridges (R-NH) had proposed President Truman call Congress into special session at once to increase American help to China.

Flagg, state public utilities commissioner. Funds from the notes are to be used for financing construction expenditures, exclusive of the Toketee Falls project, for the remainder of 1948 and part of 1949, and to reimburse the company's treasury in part for money expended for additions and improvements.
