Thomas Pleads Innocent of Pay Charges

WASHINGTON, Nov. 16 (AP)—Rep. J. Parnell Thomas pleaded innocent Monday to charges of conspiracy growing out of alleged padding of his office payrolls.

Thomas, the retiring chairman of the house un-American activities committee, was released on \$1,000 bond after being fingerprinted at the United States marshal's office.

The congressman, re-elected Nov. 2, was indicted a week ago today on charges of fraud and

conspiracy involving accusations of salary "kickbacks" from office employees.

He was arraigned before Judge Richmond B. Keech in federal district court a day ahead of schedule. His attorney, William H. Collins, said the shift was made because Thomas wished to return to his home in Allendale, N.J.
