This year's tax is 93.3 mills, compared with 70.3 mills in 1947-an increase of 23 mills. City property owners will pay a total of \$66,083 on an assessed valuation of \$708,-285. Of the total \$25,710 goes for support of city government and \$30,314 for schools.
