Stock Market Continues Drop

NEW YORK, Nov. 27 (AP)—The stock market's attempt to block the post-election decline went up in smoke this week.

About \$1,700,000,000 was lopped off the market value of all stocks listed on the exchange. Losses since the democratic election sweep have piled up to around \$7,000,000,000.

On Friday and again in today's short session the market showed signs of stabilizing but the steadiness was due more to absence of aggressive selling than to any pronounced pick-up in buying.

Grain Market Prices Firm

CHICAGO, Nov. 27 (AP)—The grain market ended on a firm note today after some shakiness during early dealings. Prices were down more than a cent in wheat and corn at one time, but when the selling pressure let up the market rebounded quickly.

Today's action was almost the exact reverse of yesterday's, when prices had opened higher and ended lower. The late rally today was in part believed to come from short covering on the part of traders who did not want to maintain a short position over the weekend.

Wheat closed 1/4-1 1/2 higher, corn was 1/4 to 1 cent higher, oats were 1/4 higher, rye was 1/4 higher, soybeans were 1 1/2-3/4 higher, and lard was 8 cents lower to 3 cents a hundred pounds higher.
