Stock Market Salem Market Continues Drop

NEW YORK, Nov. 27 -(AP)- The stock market's attempt to block the post-election decline went up in smoke this week.

About \$1,700,000,000 was loppe off the market value of all stock listed on the exchange. Losse since the democratic election sweep have piled up to around \$7,000,000,000.

On Friday and again in today short session the market showed signs of stabilizing but the steadi ness was due more to absence o aggressive selling than to an pronounced pick-up in buying.

CHICAGO, Nov. 27 -(AP)- Th grain market ended on a firm note today after some shakine during early dealings. Price were down more than a cent in wheat and corn at one time, but Portland Produce when the selling pressure let up the market rebounded quickly.
