League Board Meets

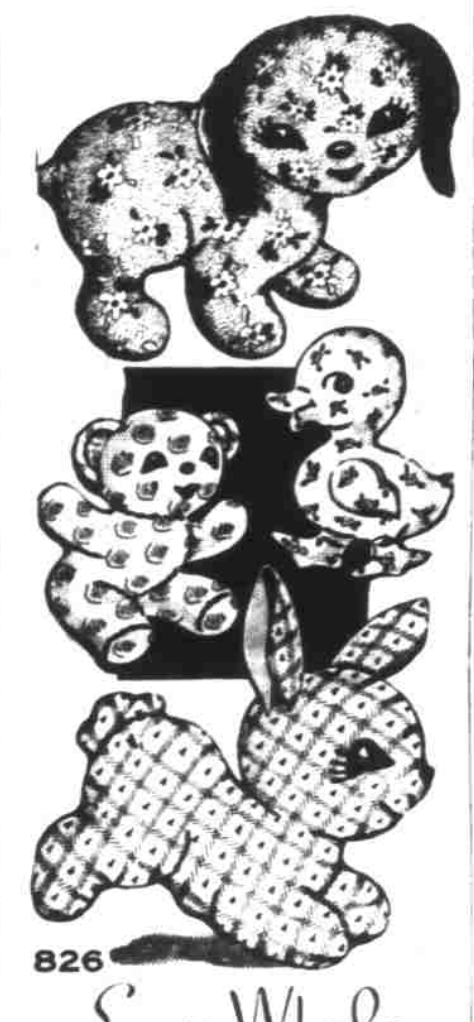
