

Polio Group Eyes Therapy Department

A committee to investigate resources and possibility of setting up a physical therapy department in Marion county, was approved Thursday night by the Marion county chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

Dr. Robert F. Anderson discussed the problems and advantages of local treatment of infantile paralysis.

Elected chairman of the Marion county group to preside until June elections was Mrs. David Wright. T. M. Medford was elected vice chairman; Dorothy Cornelius, secretary, and Lawrence Fisher, treasurer.

Elmer Church, chairman of the annual March of Dimes campaign to be held early next year, led a discussion of plans for the 1949 drive.

Reports of financial expenditures during the past two years by the Marion county chapter showed \$6,568 was spent in the county to aid in 18 cases of infantile paralysis; \$8,000 was given to the Shrine hospital for crippled children and an additional \$3,000 will be given to the hospital before the end of the year.

John T. Egan, public housing administration commissioner, said housing agency head Raymond Foley will approve funds for the work.

Officials plan to convert 100 apartments at once, with more to be remodeled should more than 100 families apply.

Bishop Decries Pre-Yule Activity

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 2.—(AP)—The Episcopal bishop of Oregon doesn't agree with "do your Christmas shopping early" or the other appurtenances of the pre-holiday season.

"Personally I dislike this anticipation of great festivals," Bishop Benjamin D. Dagwell wrote in The Oregon Churchman. "I believe in celebrating Christmas at the end of the advent season, beginning at twilight Christmas eve."

Gun Fight on Bus Injures 5

CLEVELAND, Tenn., Dec. 2.—(AP)—Bradley County Sheriff Bud Cash said five persons were shot on a bus near here today when two passengers, one white and one negro, began shooting at each other.

The sheriff quoted the bus driver, E. K. McKenzie of Cleveland, as saying the pistol riot began when the negro sat down by the white man on the bus.

Sheriff Cash identified the men who did the shooting as Jack Bennett, white, of Calhoun, Tenn., and James A. Phillips, negro.

He said Bennett was wounded in the left shoulder and that Phillips was not hit.

The bus driver said the negro sat down beside Bennett and that Bennett told him to move. When the negro refused to move, according to the driver, both men jumped out of their seats and began firing.

St. Paul Phone Firm President Dies in Wreck

ST. PAUL, Dec. 2.—Charles Sylvester Mullen, 33, died as the result of a skull fracture suffered when his truck went off the road on the edge of St. Paul at 7:30 Wednesday night.

Mullen, who was president of St. Paul Telephone company, had been working on line extensions and repairs and was returning home. The accident happened in front of his brother, Peter P. Kirkwood's place and Mrs. Mullen in the family automobile was directly behind the truck at the time of the accident.

Donald Barrick, deputy Marion county coroner, investigated the accident and Hodgson's mortuary of Newberg took charge of the body. Death resulted from a skull fracture and was believed to have been instantaneous.

Mullen was a farmer near St. Paul and besides his work with the St. Paul Telephone company he was active in the Rod and Gun club and was an active worker for the St. Paul Rodeo.

PARIS, Dec. 2.—(AP)—The security council today shelved Israel's request for membership in the United Nations by sending the application to a membership committee.

At the same time an odd combination of pro-Arab and pro-Israel countries killed two of the main sections of a British plan for a Palestine settlement which was before the assembly's political committee.

The British plan had been endorsed by the United States.

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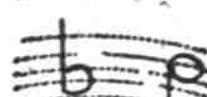
