## Literary Guidepost

By W. G. Rogers

LITERARY HISTORY OF THE UNITED STATES, in three volumes, edited by Robert E. Spiller, Willard Thorp, Thomas H. Johnson and Henry Seidel Canby (Macmillan; \$18 before publication, \$20 after).

Backed by the publisher, learned societies, councils, funds and several universities, in preparation for six years, composed of work by 55 contributors, this opus of some 2,200 pages of text and reference and source material is the only thing of its kind since the "Cambridge History" and apt to remain unchallenged for another 20 years at least.

It represents a vast endeavor, our finest scholarship, it delves, probes, investigates, searches, and comes up with a complete picture, all the groundwork and all the high spots. An author must be a more enduring poet than Edwin Arlington Robinson, who gets a whole chapter while she is bracketed with Lanier as an experimenter. Would she have more of a genius if she had lived in the thick of things in New York, instead of remaining an Amherst recluse. Is she any less great for being in MacLeish's phrase, an "irresponsible"? Can the same criticism be made of Thornton Wilder ... and did the editors make ...
