## Badger Mentor Quits Position

MADISON, Wis., Dec. 11—(AP)—Harry Stuhlreher gave up his post as head football coach at the University of Wisconsin today. But the surrender didn't cost him much. The Little General, under heavy fire all season, resigned in a dramatic move but kept his position as athletic director and his \$12,000 yearly salary.

"The double job was getting too tough," he said.

The board of Regents agreed and sent university president E. B. Fred out into the market place to find a successor.

Stuhlreher's 1948 team wound up in the Big Nine cellar with a single conference victory. It won one other game in nine starts. The "Goodbye Harry" boys, who unfurled their banner in the mid-season Yale game—which favored Wisconsin lost, 17-7—spearheaded a statewide assault on his position.

## Bomber Says Billy Faster

### Joe Urges Irishman to Continue Comeback

CHICAGO, Dec. 11—(AP)—Heavy-weight Joe Louis thinks Billy Conn is a good candidate for the wear-and-tear-to-tight-Louis club.

But some 6500 fans who saw the Brown Bomber toy with Conn in a six-round exhibition last night would say Joe just is being charitable for old times' sake.

Nursing purple bruises on his left forehead and left cheekbone, Louis said after the exhibition that Conn was "much faster" than in their 1946 meeting when Joe won on an eighth-round knockout.

"Billy is a pretty good fighter and now he can go for Ezzard Charles," Joe drawled on his dressing room table. "Conn should keep up his come-back."

Most of the writers, however, thought that Conn was lucky that Louis was wearing the big pillows.

In the third and again in the fourth rounds, Lou unleashed his dynamite left hook and jolting right cross.

Joe said Ezzard Charles' technical kayo of Joe Baksi in New York last night "proves Charles is at the best heavy around." But he qualified this by saying he'd have to study reports of the fight to determine whether Charles would be a worthy opponent.

Louis resumes his exhibition tour against Arturo Godoy at Philadelphia next Tuesday.

## 'Stran' Still Miami Leader

### Harbert Tops Course Record with Hot 62

MIAMI, Fla., Dec. 11—(AP)—Melvin (Chick) Harbert, Detroit professional, set a course record eight under par 62 in the \$10,000 Miami open golf tournament today but Amateur Frank Stranahan of Toledo, Ohio, still led the field with 200 for 54 holes.

Harbert's sensational round lifted him from a tie for fifth place at the halfway mark to a firm second with 202 strokes. Herman Barron, White Plains, N. Y., took third place with a 66 today and a total of 206.

Harbert, strapping 35-year-old son of a golf pro, literally blazed around the 6,735-yard par 70 Miami Springs course in intermittent showers with a 30 going out and a 32 coming home.

Stranahan, who posted 66s during the two opening rounds, shot 34-34-68 today.

Harbert's score broke the record 63 set by Henry Picard of Cleveland and tied by Clayton Heafner of Charlotte, N. C., last year.

Herman Keiser, Akron, Ohio, and Tony Penna, Cincinnati, had 207s with each posting par 70s. Claude Harmon of Palm Beach, Fla., was alone at 208 with his 70 today.
